Swimming Pool Employment Opportunity

The Alliance Pipeline Aquatic Centre (operated by the Macklin & District Aquatic Center Inc.) is now accepting applications for full and part time positions.

The successful applicant for Head Guard must be at least 18 years of age, have current NLS or Red Cross Lifeguard, WSI, First Aid, CPR-C, WHMIS and a pool operator's course. LSI and WSIT would be an asset. A minimum of two years of pool experience is preferred. This position requires a self-motivated individual to perform staff management and other duties.

Applicants for positions of Junior Lifeguard must be a minimum of 15 years of age and have their Bronze Cross Certification or Red Cross Lifeguard Assistant, current First Aid and CPR-C. Senior Lifeguards/Instructors require NLS or Red Cross Lifeguard and WSI certificates as well. 

SAFE WINTER WALKING TIPS



Helpful Hints When Walking on Snow or Ice

- Plan ahead, give yourself sufficient time and plan your route.
- Traffic moves slowly in snowy conditions.
- Give yourself extra time--don't assume a clear path for driving and walking will be available.

Wear shoes or boots that provide traction on snow and ice.

- Footwear made of rubber and neoprene composite provide better traction than plastic and leather soles.
- Wear flat-soled shoes. Avoid shoes with heels.
- Products are available with abrasive soles or cleats that provide special traction for walking on snow and ice, such as Yaktrax.
 [Remember to remove when entering buildings.

Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles, climbing or descending stairs, entering or leaving buildings.

- Move slowly.
- Remove snow/water from shoes when entering buildings.
- Use handrails for support.
- Try to keep your center of gravity over your support leg.
- Use car for support.
- Keep your hands out of your pockets.

Walk on designated walkways as much as possible.

- Don't take shortcuts over snow piles or areas where snow and ice removal is not feasible.
- Look ahead when you walk. A sidewalk completely covered with ice may require travel along its grassy edge for traction.
- Don't text or read while walking.

Walk safely on snow or ice.

- Take short steps or shuffle for stability.
- Bend slightly forward and walk flat-footed with your center of
- gravity directly over your feet as much as possible.
- Keep your hands out of your pockets.
- Be prepared to fall. If you fall, fall with sequential contacts at your thigh, hip and shoulder. Avoid using outstretched arms to brace yourself.





Letter from the Chief

What does it mean to be the Fire Chief on a Volunteer Fire Department??? Well, it means a lot of things...some good, some not so good. It means introducing yourself to someone who has never been in the hall before, showing them the equipment we have, and what we expect from them should they join our department. It means making sure they get the training they need on this equipment so they can use it safely when they have to. It means making sure all the equipment and gear we use is functioning properly and is certified for us to use so we can keep insurance rates as low as they can be and that our members have the best possible tools to respond to calls. It means meetings! Meetings with salesmen, truck builders, firemen's meetings, fire board meetings and meetings with businesses or corporations who want to know about our department and how or if they can help. It means ongoing training and new courses to learn what is changing and what new challenges we might face. It means working on a budget with the fire board and department members to make sure our department can keep operating at such a high standard. It means writing letters and applying for grants if and when they are available. It means staying in touch with our dispatch center to make sure our call out list is up to date. It means helping the STARS helicopter land on a highway when you're supposed to be on the bunnock courts. It means seeing the look on the face of a friend when you pull into their yard with all your trucks and his shop is fully engulfed in flames. It means working together as a team for almost 2 hours to free someone from a particularly nasty accident scene. It means sitting with your crew after a tough call and making sure the new guys and the veterans are going to be okay! It means getting to spend time with young students during Fire Prevention Week or teaching the fire safety part of the babysitter's course. It means having a child wave at you and say "I know you, you're the Fire Chief! I made my mom check our smoke detectors!!" It means staying on a scene for 21

hours straight

because sometimes things get complicated. It means a summer barbeque and a Christmas party. It means you might have to respond to a fatal car accident on Christmas Eve. It means not

knowing what the next call will be but knowing my crew will be leaving the hall in less than nine minutes when that call comes. It means false alarms. It means helping set up and light the fireworks at the Bones tournament. What a blast!! It means helping arrange parades for Grads or the Chamber of Commerce or stopping at a young one's birthday party and seeing the big grins on their faces when we pull up with lights and sirens. It means getting up at 2:02 A.M. and fighting a fire all night and having the alarm on your phone go off while you're still battling the fire. Time to get up for work....wait, what? It means having an understanding boss when you leave work on a moment's notice. It means time away from your family and realizing how lucky you are that your wife and family support you in what you are doing!! It means being proud to be able to serve the people of Macklin and District! It means PRIDE in being able to work with the dedicated people who give their valuable time to serve on the Macklin and District Fire Board. It means being very proud and honored to work and train with all of the members of Macklin and District Fire Rescue! We are a diverse group of individuals but we are a great team!! It means doing one of the most satisfying and rewarding things you can do. It means after 8 years as the Deputy and 6 years as the Chief I can step down as Chief and hand the stripes over to Justin Bast. Justin has been chief before, and he knows what he is getting into. The Department is in very capable hands!!! It means I'll probably still be writing these updates because the new chief says I do a good job!!!! Be safe out there and be kind to one another.
