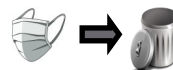

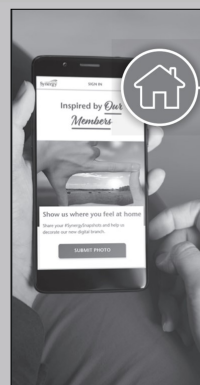

Paper Fiber Materials:

(paper, cardboard, paperboard) Items accepted include:

- *Newsprint, flyers, junk mail and envelopes (with or without the window)
- *Copy paper and computer printouts
- *Shredded paper (please place in clear plastic bag and tie shut)
- *Non-metallic gift wrap and packing paper
- *Magazines, catalogues, paperback books, telephone books
- *Hardcover books (cover and spine must be removed)
- *Paper egg cartons
- *Brown paper bags
- *Tissue and paper towel cores
- *Flattened cardboard and paperboard boxes

Paper not accepted: any fiber material that is waxed or plasticized; any material that is food contaminated (ie: used pizza box with cheese stuck to it); soiled tissues, napkins and paper towels; confetti paper; heavily dyed or coloured construction paper. **Clothes and glass jars are not recyclable items!**

Plastic: All household plastics labeled with any (#1 - #7) symbol, Containers must have a numbered arrow symbol in order to be recycled. Some examples include: water bottles, shampoo bottles, liquid detergent jugs, milk jugs/cartons, juice boxes and all tetra pak containers, pop/water bottles, vinegar bottles, yogurt and margarine containers, windshield washer fluid jugs, etc. ***Plastic not accepted:** Styrofoam, plastic toys, Tupperware, plastic pipe, outdoor lawn furniture, and all containers without the recycle symbol (#1 - #7).



Metal :

Metal items must be completely rinsed which includes aluminum cans, pop/beer cans, trays pie plates and foil. **Metal items not accepted include:** wire hangers, propane tanks, batteries, auto parts, hazardous chemical containers. **Also not accepted are glass bottles and jars.**

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery New Entrance Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee desires to undertake a capital project to aesthetically improve the entrance into the cemetery. The project being considered will include the relocation and upgrade of the historic entrance gates to the cemetery. These memorial gates were constructed in 1953 and featured stone pillars, iron gates and an arched sign display. The evolution of road maintenance equipment and passenger vehicles rendered the entrance too small and the gates unusable for more than a decade.

It is the desire of the Lakeview Cemetery Operations Committee to reinvent and relocate the entrance. The entrance will be relocated to the east boundary opening and will include modern stone pillars to support the restored historic arched iron gates. Every attempt possible will be undertaken to try and relocate the existing stone pillars to a suitable location within the cemetery.

As funds will allow the completed project will incorporate a stone pillar and wrought iron fence along the complete east boundary of the cemetery property. This legacy project is a continuation of the cemetery beautification initiative project that has been ongoing for the past number of years. At this moment we are canvassing for donations towards the project and look forward to seeing this worthwhile project completed. The Lakeview Cemetery is a community space that demonstrates our commitment to respectfully commemorate those that have been laid to rest.

News from the Fire Hall

Welcome to Spring Everyone!! It certainly has come in like a lamb. It is nice to see more hours of daylight. Remember that with Spring conditions (freezing and thawing) that road surfaces can change very quickly. Always use caution if there is blowing snow and pay attention to weather forecasts if you are traveling. The warmer weather is always a good time to remind everyone to be careful around ice and bodies of water. Ice can become very weak and "rotten" now. It might look thick enough to walk on but isn't. This is when it becomes very dangerous for pets and people.

We have already had to respond to a grass fire so please be very careful with burning pits, garbage bins or old brush piles. The wind can stir up embers weeks after a burn and spread in the grass around. Dry conditions on top and muddy conditions underneath makes it very challenging for us to get around. Also do not throw cigarettes out of a vehicle. We have attended many ditch fires in the past that have started this way!

In the past month we have been very fortunate to have added an automatic generator to our Firehall. Now in the event of a power failure the hall will automatically switch over to it's own power source. We have had to respond to incidents in the past (during extreme wind storms) and the power is out. We then have to respond to a dark hall and crank the door up by hand. These conditions add precious time to our ability to respond quickly to our calls.

I would like to thank the Fire Board for their help in allowing us to get this done. Also thanks to Cam Putz from Reinbold Electric and Therin Doetzel from Rod's Plumbing and Cooling for donating their time to get the new Generac hooked up and running. It is very impressive to see this thing go!! That's all from the Hall. Be safe out there!
