Responsibilities of animal owners:

- Animal does Not Run at Large
- Ensure animal does Not enter School ground, playgrounds, sports fields, golf course, cemetery or other areas where prohibited by posted signs.
- Owners who harbor a dog in a front yard or unfenced yard shall ensure animal is kept a minimum of 3 meters from sidewalk/roadway or property line.
- Animal owner shall ensure that if animal defecates on any public or private property other than the property of its Owner, the Owner shall remove such feces immediately.
- Ensure animal does not: bite, bark at, or chase animals, bicycles, automobiles or persons.

ATV Vehicles



The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner. Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.



Grass Clippings and Compost

It is the responsibility of each property owner to dispose of any grass clippings or compost material. There is an area designated for this at the waste transfer station where compost materials may be emptied from their bags and deposited at no charge.

It is not an acceptable practice to place compost or grass clippings along the back alley or lane adjacent to your property.

RCMP MACKLIN REPORT - March 16—April 12

- RCMP received a Mental Health Act complaint. This matter is still under investigation.
- A 24-year-old female from Macklin was charged with two counts of Assault with a Weapon, Assault and Uttering Threats after Members received a complaint of uttering threats.
- Members are investigating a complaint of sexual assault.
- Police received a report of a lost wallet. The wallet has not been located.
- RCMP received a complaint of a break and enter into a residence. This matter is still under investigation.
- Police received a report of a traffic collision. This matter is still under investigation.
- Members received a complaint of uttering threats but it was unfounded.
- RCMP received a complaint of disturbing the peace but there was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a complaint of theft. This matter is still under investigation.
- RCMP received a report of a shop fire in a rural area near Macklin. The fire was extinguished by Macklin Fire Department and was not suspicious in nature.
- Police received another complaint of uttering threats. The subject of complaint was located out of province and was arrested by another RCMP Detachment.
- Members discussed COVID 19 health restrictions with a local business.
- RCMP received a complaint of criminal harassment but there was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- RCMP received a report of a vehicle collision with a deer. There were no injuries. Reported for insurance purposes.
- Police received a complaint of shoplifting. Reported for information purposes. The complainant requested no further action be taken. Members are investigating a complaint of a sexual assault.
- RCMP received a report of a suspicious vehicle in a rural farmyard. Members patrolled but could not locate the subject of complaint.
- Police received a complaint of an intoxicated individual in a residence yard. Member located the subject of complaint who was in the care of a family member.
- There was also one false 911 call and four traffic complaints.
- RCMP received a report of cattle on Highway 31 east of Primate. Members attended but the cattle had already been herded back into the pasture.
- Agro-Greens Natural Products reported product lost in shipment on three different occasions in March and April. Reported as per policy.
- A 56-year-old Macklin female was charged with two counts of Uttering Threats after Members received a complaint of threats.

Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Eid was a pioneering doctor in Macklin, who served this community for many years. After his death a scholarship fund was set up to help young people from the Macklin area who were hoping to enter a profession in the medical field. There are now 3 entry level scholarship categories available with the Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship. All three scholarships are one-time lump sum payments.

Grade 12 Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student directly entering a medical related program right after high school. This could include, but is not limited to: Nursing, Paramedic, Lab Tech, Dental Hygienist, etc.

2. Continuing Education Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student who has needed to complete prerequisite education before entering into a medical field and has now been accepted into their medical related college. This could include, but is not limited to: Medical Doctor, Pharmacist, Dentist, Physio Therapist, Nursing etc.

3. Mature Student Scholarship

A scholarship of up to \$3000 will be awarded to a student who has been out of high school for at least one year, and is now entering a medical related field of study.

To apply for these scholarships include the following:

*A cover letter explaining what field you have chosen to study and the length of the program. *Why you believe you are suited for that career, and where and when you have attended high school and the principal and vice principal at the time you graduated. *A transcript of marks, either high school or post secondary, whichever is more recent. *A copy of your letter of acceptance or conditional acceptance from the institution you are applying to. *Candidates can only receive one of these scholarships.

Cemetery Update

We wish to express our sincerest thanks to families and friends who continue to generously donate to the Lakeview Cemetery. Commemorative Donations can be made at any time and will be put towards the continual beautification of the cemetery. On going perpetual care donations are also accepted at anytime to help with the general upkeep of the plots where our loved one's rest.

In 2019 the Lakeview Cemetery Committee officially adopted a set of regulation regarding the control and operation of the cemetery. This Cemetery Bylaw sets out the general operating guidelines for the cemetery.

The following guidelines apply in respect to flowers and other items place on a grave site:

- *No cement slabs, grave covering, trees, or flower beds are permitted.*
- *All flowers must be placed into a vase or holder that is affixed to the monument.*
- *Placement of decorative items like solar lights and steppingstones must be placed to not interfere with grass cutting and maintenance.*
- *No unauthorized monument, bench or obstruction is permitted.*
- *Existing benches or obstruction shall be removed at the discretion of the Committee.*

If anyone wishes to have landscaping completed around a grave site (i.e. sunken grave) please contact the town office. The cemetery committee employs a maintenance contractor who is willing to provide additional maintenance for private requests. News from the Fire Hall

Hi all,

Spring has sprung, the grass is rize, I wonder where the flowers is? Spring is here, and obviously it is very dry out. The Macklin Fire Department is recommending no burning at this time until moisture conditions change. We have responded to numerous grass fires already and so have our neighboring departments. If you have a burning pit or brush piles that have been burning in the last month, please check on them. The sun and wind can stir up embers from fires that were lit several weeks ago, and these can spread very quickly. If you are a farmer in the area, it might be a good idea to hook up a discer or pro-till and have it ready just in case. We have also had farmers in the past who have had their water hauling units for their sprayers full and ready to go. In previous years, we have filled up our grassland trucks with the water supplied from these units. Tractors, cultivators, or water hauling units are a huge asset

when wind is spreading fire quickly. I would also like to remind you NOT to throw cigarettes out of a moving vehicle as this is a very common cause of ditch fires. If you live in town, please use caution when using a fire pit or BBQ. Never leave a fire unattended, and always have a garden hose ready. Please ensure your fires are completely extinguished when you are done.

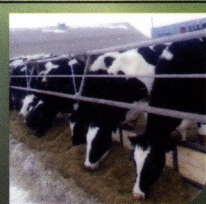

Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!
