• We invite you to view the parade from the comfort of your own front yards as we show our support & celebrate The Class of 2021!



Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.



- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!



Grass Clippings and Compost

It is the responsibility of each property owner to dispose of any grass clippings or compost material. There is an area designated for this at the waste transfer station where compost materials may be emptied from their bags and deposited at no charge. It is <u>not</u> an acceptable practice to place compost or grass

clippings along the back alley or lane adjacent to your property.



The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by

calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner. Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.







Cemetery Update

We wish to express our sincerest thanks to families and friends who continue to generously donate to the Lakeview Cemetery. Commemorative Donations can be made at any time and will be put towards the continual beautification of the cemetery. On going perpetual care donations are also accepted at anytime to help with the general upkeep of the plots where our loved one's rest. In 2019 the Lakeview Cemetery Committee officially adopted a set of regulation regarding the control and operation of the cemetery. This Cemetery Bylaw sets out the general operating guidelines for the cemetery.

The following guidelines apply in respect to flowers and other items place on a grave site:

- No cement slabs, grave covering, trees, or flower beds are permitted.
- All flowers must be placed into a vase or holder that is affixed to the monument.
- Placement of decorative items like solar lights and steppingstones must be placed to not interfere with grass cutting and maintenance.
- No unauthorized monument, bench or obstruction is permitted.
- Existing benches or obstruction shall be removed at the discretion of the Committee.

If anyone wishes to have landscaping completed around a grave site (i.e. sunken grave) please contact the town office. The cemetery committee employs a maintenance contractor who is willing to provide additional maintenance for private requests.
