Responsibilities of animal owners:

- Animal does Not Run at Large
- Ensure animal does Not enter School ground, playgrounds, sports fields, golf course, cemetery or other areas where prohibited by posted signs.
- Owners who harbor a dog in a front yard or unfenced yard shall ensure animal is kept a minimum of 3 meters from sidewalk/roadway or property line.
- Animal owner shall ensure that if animal defecates on any public or private property other than the property of its Owner, the Owner shall remove such feces immediately.
- Ensure animal does not: bite, bark at, or chase animals, bicycles, automobiles or persons.

Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!

Grass Clippings and Compost



It is the responsibility of each property owner to dispose of any grass clippings or compost material. There is an area designated for this at the waste transfer station where compost materials may be emptied from their bags and deposited at no charge. It is not an acceptable practice to place compost or grass clippings along the back alley or lane adjacent to your property.

Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

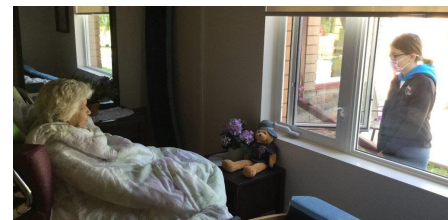

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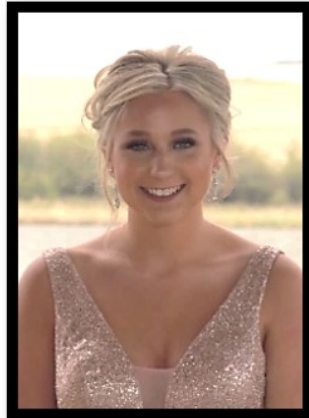

Cemetery Update

We wish to express our sincerest thanks to families and friends who continue to generously donate to the Lakeview Cemetery. Commemorative Donations can be made at any time and will be put towards the continual beautification of the cemetery. On going perpetual care donations are also accepted at anytime to help with the general upkeep of the plots where our loved one's rest. In 2019 the Lakeview Cemetery Committee officially adopted a set of regulation regarding the control and operation of the cemetery. This Cemetery Bylaw sets out the general operating guidelines for the cemetery.

★ The following guidelines apply in respect to flowers and other items placed on a grave site:

- No cement slabs, grave covering, trees, or flower beds are permitted.
- All flowers must be placed into a vase or holder that is affixed to the monument.
- Placement of decorative items like solar lights and steppingstones must be placed to not interfere with grass cutting and maintenance.
- No unauthorized monument, bench or obstruction is permitted.
- Existing benches or obstruction shall be removed at the discretion of the Committee.

If anyone wishes to have landscaping completed around a grave site (i.e. sunken grave) please contact the town office. The cemetery committee employs a maintenance contractor who is willing to provide additional maintenance for private requests. Property Nuisance Bylaw

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice.

For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance. 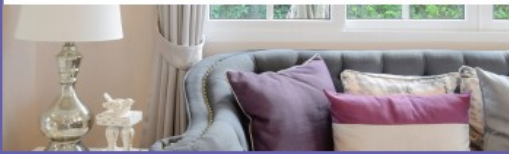

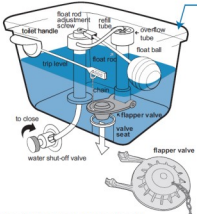
Every Drop Counts

How to fix your toilet:

The flapper is the most common cause of running toilets.

Take the lid off the back of the toilet and see if the flapper is all the way down against the valve seat or if it is hanging open.

If it is hanging open, try moving the arm that is attached to the flapper and see if it falls back down to the bottom of the tank. Check to see if anything is blocking the flapper from returning to the bottom such as the chain or sediment. If so, remove the impediments.



A slower leak can be more difficult to identify and can be caused by the valve seat being damaged. The best way to fix this leak is to replace the valve seat. If your toilet is new, it may be leaking too. Take the leaky toilet test and see!

Take the leaky toilet test:

A leaky toilet can waste as much as 950 litres of water per day or the volume of 12 bathtubs a day!



Directions:

1. Remove the tank cover and put food coloring in the tank
2. DO NOT FLUSH
3. Wait 30 minutes.
4. If the water in the bowl remains clear there are no leaks!
5. If the water in the bowl turns blue, there is a leak in your tank!

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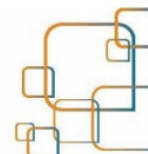

CAST IRON WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT

The Town of Macklin has been awarded an Investing In Canada Infrastructure Grant in the amount of \$1.45 million to be used towards the replacement of all cast iron water mains. The entire project is valued at \$1.97 million with contributions from the Government of Canada (40%) the Government of Saskatchewan (33.33%) and the Town of Macklin (26.67%). The project involves the removal and replacement of all existing cast iron water main lines that were installed in the 1960's and replacing them with new PVC lines. These cast iron lines are greatly deteriorated due to corrosion and breakage and there is potential for substantial water being lost daily through minor undetectable leaks. The life expectancy of the new PVC lines is over 100 years. The anticipated construction timeline is August 2021 until August 2022. The contract for this important community improvement has been awarded to Gee Bee Construction under the supervision of SAL Engineering.

The scope of project will include:

- Replacement of approximately 2,900 metres of cast iron water main lines
- Replacement of valves and hydrants
- Replacement of service connection saddles and curb stops as required
- Supply of Temporary water supply during construction
- Engineering consulting services and a geotechnical investigation.



The completion of this major community infrastructure investment is being coordinated with the ongoing pavement local improvement project. It is important that these two major community improvements are coordinated, we desire to eliminate any unnecessary overlap or delay in improving our infrastructure. As a community we do not experience a large volume of water breaks, however, the current cast iron lines are reaching their life expectancy. Through the provision of this infrastructure grant we can address an anticipated major infrastructure problem before it becomes a reality.

Locals Competitors Excel at Festival Provincials

During Saskatchewan and Alberta's recent virtual Provincial Music Festival finals, two local competitors excelled in the Speech category. Steyn Hoogstad was awarded first place in the Excellence Class for Speech Arts 17 years and under. Willem Hoogstad was announced winner in the Intermediate Concert Group for Speech Arts 17 years and under and was also awarded first place in the Excellence Class for Speech Arts 12 years and under. Both boys are taught by Stacy Berg-Lloyd from Provost and were therefore allowed to compete in the Alberta Provincial Music Festival as well. In Alberta's finals, Steyn placed second in the Speech Solo 16 years and under category and Willem came second in the Speech Solo 12 years and under category.

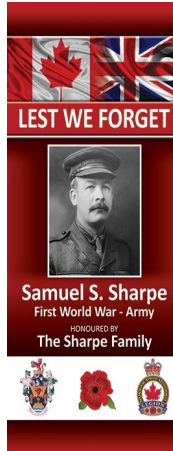
Planting Ceremony in Evesham
