2021 Town of Macklin Municipal by-election Information

WHO CAN VOTE?

In order to vote in a municipal election you must:

- be a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years of age;
- a Saskatchewan resident for six consecutive months before election day; AND
- Have resided in the municipality, or on land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day; OR
- Is the owner of assessable land in the municipality, or land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day.



Masks are Mandatory

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING TO VOTE?

When you attend the polling station to vote, ALL VOTERS will be required to present valid identification. Identification accepted includes:

- One photo piece of government-issued ID (Example: drivers license with photo, name and address); OR
- Two pieces of ID, one with address (Example: birth certificate and utility invoice)

WHAT TO EXPECT

**When arriving at the Macklin Credit Union Legacy Hall to vote, you will enter through the Main Entrance doors.*

**In order to ensure one way traffic you will be asked to leave using the opposing main entrance doors. *Upon entering, we ask you to hand sanitize and follow physical distancing markings throughout the building.*

**Election staff will be sanitizing high traffic areas throughout the day.*

NEWS FROM THE FIRE HALL

Hey All. I hope you are having a great fall and enjoying the nice weather that we are having!! (As of this writing!)

The past month has been very busy at the hall. The first week of October we had Fire Prevention week and we hosted close to 150 kids from the school and play school. We talked to them about Smoke detectors and the importance of practicing fire drills at home just like they do at school. Does your family have a meeting place where you would all go if you had to evacuate your house if you had a fire? This year we did do the ride to school in a fire truck. Victoria Kohlman from Mrs. Carter's grade 2 class was the lucky winner. We always enjoy having the students to the hall and they seem to like it too. I hope you all learned something and see you again next year!!

The Fire Department has been very fortunate this past month as we have received two very generous donations. I would like to thank Dan from Lavigne's Sand and Gravel Ltd. for the \$500.00 donation. Rona Macklin also held a raffle for a Green Mountain Smoker/Grill. The tickets sold out very quickly. I would like to thank all of you who bought tickets and supported our department. Bert Gartner was the lucky winner. Rona then donated the proceeds of the draw, \$2000.00, to the Fire Department. Thank you Rona Macklin for thinking of us. The money from both donations will go directly towards upgrading our rescue/extrication tools. (Jaws of Life) Donations like the ones mentioned above are a very important part of how a Volunteer Fire Department can stay current with the tools we use. THANK YOU again.

I had a reader of this column ask if I would write about what you should do if you come upon a car accident. This is a very valid request!! First of all, as with any emergency where it looks like someone has been hurt call 911. This is a very important first step. If you can't do this make sure you ask someone else on scene to do this. (Example: Hey you in the Blue Jacket please call 911 and tell me when you have done this) The dispatcher will ask you what type of incident you are calling in. We have had people tell us when they called 911 it seems like a long time to be on the phone but the people taking these calls are highly trained and they will have dispatched us as soon as they know we are needed. They will keep you on the phone and get as much information from you as they can; how many vehicles, how many people are involved, location etc. As they are getting this information we are already getting a page and are responding to the hall. Try to stay calm and answer the questions they are asking. This information will be passed on to us when we get to the hall and will help us prepare for what we have to do when we get to the scene. Once you know 911 has been called, check the scene over for hazards before approaching the cars. Are there downed powerlines or other factors that will affect your safety as you approach this area? Remember to watch for traffic, especially in icy or foggy conditions. If there are other people

on scene, get them to turn their hazard lights on to slow down other cars. Once you feel it is safe, approach the cars involved if you can. 911 dispatchers will be asking you for updates as you are doing this. Are people hurt? How many? Are they trapped in the vehicle? All this information is passed on to us when we get to the hall. If the people are not in immediate danger you can leave them where they are. You should only move them if they are in immediate danger. If it is cold you can try to keep them warm with blankets, coats etc. or let them sit in another vehicle if they can walk. Try to keep everyone calm and warm. If someone on the scene has fairly serious injuries relay this information to the 911 dispatchers and they will instruct you as to what you should do. We have talked to people who called 911 after and they said the 911 operators were very helpful and helped them keep calm as they assisted the people on scene. Once EMS has arrived give them a quick update and let them do their jobs. If you saw the accident we might ask you to remain on scene until the police arrive. They might ask you for a brief statement.

If you are coming upon a scene where EMS is already there please stop, turn on your hazards and wait for instructions from police or firefighters who are directing traffic. Please be patient!!! We will get you on your way as soon as it is safe to do so. Remember a little bit of your time is maybe not as important as what we are dealing with. Please remember someone else might be having a lot worse day than you. Also PLEASE PLEASE put your phones away. You should be concentrating on getting past the scene safely and not running over any first responders. Also never post any pictures (People have actually done is!!! Why???) Just remember, what if it was one of your family members that was in that accident. Is this how you would want to find out? There are people who are trained to talk to families in these cases. Let them and us do our jobs!!! Please use common sense and let us and everyone else get through these situations the best and safest way possible.

All candidates are listed in alphabetical order



Councillor Candidate: Hello, my name is Terry Bevan and I am 60 years old. For the past 16 years, I have worked in healthcare as a Rehabilitation Assistant as well as a Recreation Assistant. My education background is in Human Service Work, specializing in Child, Youth, and Families. In addition, if you need a haircut, I am also a licenced hairdresser. And as of this month, I have accepted the position for COVID Coordinator for Living Sky School Division No. 202.

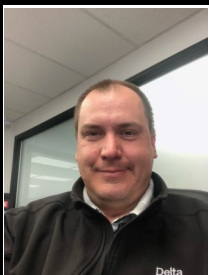

Councillor Candidate: My Name is Rob McCaffery I am 38 years old; I have my wife Kristen and my son Keelan we have lived in Macklin for 9 years; I have worked for the Co-op for 18 years and with delta for the last 9.

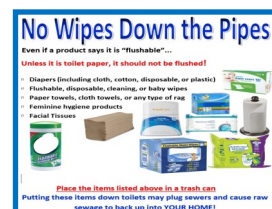

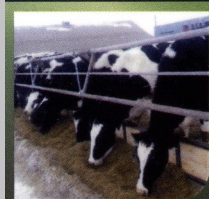
