Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner.

Complaints under the All Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP. As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property of any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

Town Bylaw 01/10 allows snowmobiles and ATV's to operate in Town limits Only for the purpose of exiting or entering the community. When entering or exiting the most direct route should be followed.

## Littering/Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping involves the unauthorized disposal of waste on Public or Private property. Not only is illegal dumping harmful to the environment, it is also unsightly.

The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010 prohibits littering. In section 50(1) it states No person shall discard, or abandon or cause to be discarded or abandoned or allow to be discarded or abandoned, any waste:

(a) on any land that is owned by another person or the Crown.

The fines laid out for Illegal Dumping can be found in The Summary Offences Procedure Regulations, 1991, and are as follows:

If found to be guilty of discarding or abandoning or causing to be discarded or abandoned or allowing to be discarded or abandoned any waste in an improper manner the fine for an individual is \$500.00.

If found guilty of discarding or abandoning or causing to be discarded or abandoned or allowing to be discarded or abandoned any waste on land owned by another person of the Crown, the fine for the individual is \$500.00.

Any person convicted will also be subject to a Victim Surcharge, which can be found in *The Victims of Crime Regulations, 1997*, which states that an additional \$80.00 charge is applied to the \$500.00 fine.

**How can you help us......** Illegal dumping can be reported by calling the R.M. of Eye Hill, No. 382 Office at 306-753-2075. If you witness any illegal dumping we ask that you try to obtain any valuable information including; photo/video information, the license plate number and vehicle description, a description of the individuals involved, the items illegally dumped as well as the time, date and

location of the incident.

Illegal dumping is both a public and environmental health risk and we urge you to dispose of your waste responsibly.



### **NEWS FROM THE FIRE HALL**

Hey All!! Happy New Year to you!! I hope you had a happy and safe Christmas season and got to spend lots of time with friends and family!

As of this writing the forecast was for very cold to start the month. The cold months always give the furnace a work out. Remember to get your furnace serviced regularly and change the filter as well. A furnace that isn't working properly can cause deadly odorless gas to enter your home. Make sure you have a functioning Carbon monoxide alarm installed in your house. This is your best protection and gives you an early warning for what could be a very dangerous situation. Test yours and check for an expiration date on it. If your carbon monoxide detector alarms, get everyone out of the house and open some windows for ventilation. Call your gas company and they can test your air quality and advise you as to what to do. You can also call 911 as well.

Remember to check your chimney as well and make sure it is not freezing up. Some of the houses with high efficiency furnaces have the chimney coming out at floor level and the can drift over with now. Keep an eye out for this as well. 2021 was an average year for call outs for our department. We responded to 24 calls. About 40% were car accidents, 50% were field or structure fires and 10% were other calls.

Our membership has stayed fairly steady at 19 members. We sure could use a couple more volunteers. As always feel free to contact Justin, myself or any member of our department if you have any questions or have ever considered joining our department.

We have four members currently taking the NFPA 1001 professional firefighter course. I would like to thank Andre Benwell, James Stang, Logan Sieben, and Neyl Manlapig for their time and dedication to stepping up and giving up a lot of Wednesday nights as they work towards the end of this course. Thank you men!! Justin has now been the chief for a year already and he is doing a great job!!! He spends lots of time at the hall working to improve our department. Thank you Justin for your time and dedication to our department.

We do have Covid 19 rapid test kits at the hall now. If you need some for you or your family watch our Facebook page for times when we are there handing them out or just contact any member of the department and we can get them for you!!


#### RCMP MACKLIN REPORT Nov 30—Dec 20, 2021

#### Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been working towards aesthetically improving the entrance into the cemetery. The project that has been initiated will include the relocation and upgrade of the historic entrance gates to the cemetery. The restoration of the memorial gates and installation of new wrought iron fencing, featuring stone pillars, is our project goal for next year.

The entrance will be relocated to the east boundary opening and will include modern stone pillars to support the restored historic



arched iron gates. Every attempt possible will be undertaken to try and relocate the existing stone pillars to a suitable location within the cemetery.

To date donation funds have allowed us to purchase the wrought iron fencing, relocate trees and complete the required survey and elevation drafting. As funds will allow the project will now move towards completion of the stone pillars and wrought iron fencing along the complete east boundary of the cemetery property.

At this moment we are canvassing for donations towards the project and look forward to seeing this worthwhile project completed. The Lakeview Cemetery is a community space that demonstrates our commitment to respectfully commemorate those that have been laid to rest.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces. A donation of \$3,000 will provide individual sponsorship of one ornate stone pillar. A commemorative plaque will be inlaid within the stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution to the project.
