



#### NEWS FROM THE FIRE HALL

Well now hasn't the weather lately been a special kind of special? The last three weeks Mother Nature and Old Man Winter have certainly covered all the bases of a crazy Canadian winter. Everything from extreme cold to snow storms to above freezing temps and rain. Sometimes in less than 36 hours. Of course this creates very challenging winter driving conditions. Some of the icy roads we have seen in the last 2 weeks are the worst and most dangerous I have ever seen. When conditions are this bad we ask that you please consider how important your travel plans are. We were called out last week at 10:12 PM. It was dark and visibility was near zero because of the heavy blowing snow. Just leaving the hall is a risk for our crew. We had to drive very slowly and were basically right at the scene of the accident before we could see it. Now we are stopped on an icy dark highway trying to help people and we are constantly listening and watching for signs of approaching vehicles. We actually park our trucks at an angle on both sides of the incident so that if someone comes in too fast the trucks will protect us where we were working. If you are driving and you think you see flashing blue or red lights slow down immediately because those lights might not be moving. We will also use red road flares and pink Accident ahead signs if we have time. Always remember there are emergency workers and people in need of help on these scenes. PLEASE turn on your hazard lights and use patience and common sense if you are on the highway. We will get you on your way as soon as it is safe to do so. Let's get EVERYONE home safely!!!

Macklin & District Fire Rescue has also started to raise money so we can purchase a new set of rescue tools. (Commonly known as the Jaws Of Life) Our current set is 20 years old and in need of some upgrades to keep it certified. Like all things, huge improvements have been made in rescue tools in the last 20 years. The new ones are stronger, lighter, quicker and more user friendly! New vehicles too are also using higher strength steel and require this new tools for use to gain access in the event of an acci-

dent. Of course the tools are also very expensive. We have already received very generous donations from local businesses, oil companies and the Kin Club in town. Recent donations from Rona Macklin, Synergy Credit Union, Alliance Pipelines, Strathcona Resources and Steelview (See attached picture) have got us off to a very good start but we have a long way to go!! If you or a business you are involved with would like to help us get these new tools or you have any questions about what we are trying to accomplish, please feel free to contact Chief Justin Bast, myself or anyone on our department.

Rod Soderlund has just informed us he will be stepping down after 27 years of dedicated service. His new job has him working out of town and he feels like he is not able to make it to enough meetings and calls. Rod had a great ability to think outside the box on rescue scenes. At one car accident we attended, the person could not speak English so Rod downloaded a translation app on his phone and we were then able to communicate with the person. He will be missed!! Good luck in you new career Rod and thank you for your time and dedication to our department!!!

This once again leaves us down another member. If you have ever thought of joining our department please feel free to talk to anyone of us. We will gladly answer all your questions and show you around the hall if you would like to see what we have and what we do.

Remember "What if volunteer fire fighters didn't volunteer!!" It can be a very challenging and rewarding way to give back to your community and district!! Be Safe and be kind to each other.
