






Terry Elder and I had the honor of representing Macklin and District Fire Rescue at his funeral at the Castor Fire Hall

Lieutenant-Colonel (R) Edward James Smith MSC, CD

Lieutenant-Colonel (R) Edward James Smith MSC, CD passed away at the Belleville General Hospital on Tuesday, 2 February, 2022.

LCol Smith was a decorated and highly respected airman. Outstanding leadership, initiative, motivation and dedication were the words on his Meritorious Service Cross decoration award.

Ed was raised in Macklin Saskatchewan, and as a youth enjoyed a typical small-town prairie upbringing – sports such as hockey, curling, softball, hunting - and early employment (to earn a few bucks). He was the son of George and Margaret and the brother of Ron and Lynda (deceased in 2018). He also mourned the loss of daughter-in-law Robin in 2006.

Ed enrolled in the Canadian Forces in 1957 and experienced a unique and rich career. He was trained as an Al Navigator, flying in the CF 100 in Canada and Europe, cross-trained to long-range Air Navigator, flying out

of Greenwood and Summerside with 415 Sqn (flying the Argus) and at the age of 30 was authorized to cross-train as a pilot. Following a stint in Moose Jaw flying Tutors, he moved into the Air Transport world where he quickly made a name for himself, rising to command 436 Squadron in Trenton Ont.

His MSC was awarded for his leadership in Operation Vagabond, a United Nations peacekeeping airlift in the Middle East in August and September of 1988.

During his tour in Summerside PEI he met Barbara Compton, the love of his life. Sons Duane (Tish) and Darren (Diane) and grandchildren Tyler, Jessica, and Connor were the blessings of this happy union.

Following retirement Ed and Barb adopted a Snowbird lifestyle, enjoying their travels, golf, and family. However, the RCAF remained an important part of their lives; Ed served as CO of the air cadet camps for several summers, he was a Director of the RCAF Museum for many years, a member of the RCAF Association (Picton Wing) and an active member of the Royal Canadian Legion.

At Ed's request there will be no formal funeral. Ashes will be interred in the St John's Anglican Cemetery in St Eleanor's, PEI by the family at a future date. Messages of condolence and remembrance may be shared at darren71smith@gmail.com

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project
