## Macklin & District Foodbank – Year in Review

Macklin Foodbank and Secret Santa wound down 2021 in the same fashion as most other people and groups. There was a last flurry of activity to pack and deliver Christmas hampers and gifts so families could enjoy a Christmas meal and have presents for their children. Our volunteers were helped by members of Synergy Credit Union who have long stepped up to help us at this time.

2021 was a year of contrasts. Hopes were high in the spring as we foresaw a wane in the pandemic and its restrictions. And then that hope faded. Demand was much lower this year than in previous years which we did not expect. Donations to us were higher than former years which didn't surprise us too much. The Macklin and surrounding community have always supported us in tough times. As well we had strong support from Corporate and Business donors.

On the local front early in the year Ayrey Farms made a substantial donation of meat to us. Meat is one thing we rarely provide in our hampers. That donation allowed us to provide it in our hampers throughout the year as well as share it with neighboring food banks.

**Greg Risling** for several years has undertaken a "Heritage Harvest" on a portion of his farm using antique equipment. With the help of Shane, Jason, and Cody Kohlman to seed and spray Greg was able to deliver the harvest to Viterra who then matched the proceeds. Greg returns all the proceeds to the community, and we are one of the grateful recipients.

2021 also saw the return of support by the students of Macklin School. Through the SRC they were able to resume food drives. The Halloween Hunger food drive alone surpassed 500 lbs. This drive and others they do allow us to restock our shelves and maintain our program.

Lastly a shout out to our Foodbank volunteers. These are the members of our community who give so freely of their time and effort. Stocking shelves, collecting donations, filling hampers, and doing the myriad little things that make a foodbank run. They are the boots on the ground working behind the scenes to carry on our day-to-day activities with little fanfare or publicity.

There are a lot of donors who support us. CP Rail maintained its donations even though the Christmas Holiday Train was virtual once again. Donors large and small, local, and remote continued to help us help those in difficulty. ***To all our supporter, we extend a heartfelt thank you.*** With your donors we are in a very strong position to continue support to any who approach us. Bring what it may the Macklin Foodbank looks to another year with optimism.

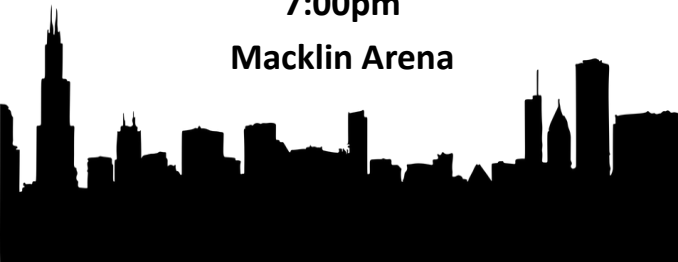

Stephen John Rayfield and his family moved to Canada from Sittingbourne, Kent, England in 2013. They lived in Halkirk and then Castor, Alberta. He worked for Vestas. The company that manages the wind mill farm by Halkirk. In 2015 Stephen and Cheryl welcomed their third child. The same year he joined the a Volunteer Fire Department.

By all accounts he was full of energy and a love for life. Everyone who met him, whether is was through work, after hours or at the rink coaching said his energy and passion for life was immediately apparent. They said you wanted to try harder (at work or at life) just so you could keep up with him. In 2017 they moved to Castor and he joined the Castor Volunteer Fire Department. Stephen and his family fit in right away in Castor and made many friends quickly. Stephen coach hockey and soccer and Cheryl started instructing fitness classes. Stephen died during a call out to a motor vehicle accident near Castor on Feb 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022. He was 39 years old. He leaves behind his wife Cheryl, sons Bradley and Sawyer and daughter Chloe, parents John and Katrina and a brother Andrew.


Terry Elder and I had the honor of representing Macklin and District Fire Rescue at his funeral at the Castor Fire Hall

February 15<sup>th</sup>. This is the second funeral I have attended for a Volunteer that has been killed in the line of duty. It is hard to describe the pain and brotherhood/sisterhood you feel when you are in a large firehall full of first responders from all over Canada. We are all there for the same purpose. To support the family and a small town department that are struggling through an incredibly hard time. It is an experience you never forget. Rest in peace Stephen. We will take it from here.

Lieutenant-Colonel (R) Edward James Smith MSC, CD passed away at the Belleville General Hospital on Tuesday, 2 February, 2022.

LCol Smith was a decorated and highly respected airman. Outstanding leadership, initiative, motivation and dedication were the words on his Meritorious Service Cross decoration award.

Ed was raised in Macklin Saskatchewan, and as a youth enjoyed a typical small-town prairie upbringing – sports such as hockey, curling, softball, hunting - and early employment (to earn a few bucks). He was the son of George and Margaret and the brother of Ron and Lynda (deceased in 2018). He also mourned the loss of daughter-in-law Robin in 2006.

Ed enrolled in the Canadian Forces in 1957 and experienced a unique and rich career. He was trained as an AI Navigator, flying in the CF 100 in Canada and Europe, cross-trained to long-range Air Navigator, flying out of Greenwood and Summerside with 415 Sqn (flying the Argus) and at the age of 30 was authorized to cross-train as a pilot. Following a stint in Moose Jaw flying Tutors, he moved into the Air Transport world where he quickly made a name for himself, rising to command 436 Squadron in Trenton Ont.

His MSC was awarded for his leadership in Operation Vagabond, a United Nations peacekeeping airlift in the Middle East in August and September of 1988.

During his tour in Summerside PEI he met Barbara Compton, the love of his life. Sons Duane (Tish) and Darren (Diane) and grandchildren Tyler, Jessica, and Connor were the blessings of this happy union.

Following retirement Ed and Barb adopted a Snowbird lifestyle, enjoying their travels, golf, and family. However, the RCAF remained an important part of their lives; Ed served as CO of the air cadet camps for several summers, he was a Director of the RCAF Museum for many years, a member of the RCAF Association (Picton Wing) and an active member of the Royal Canadian Legion.

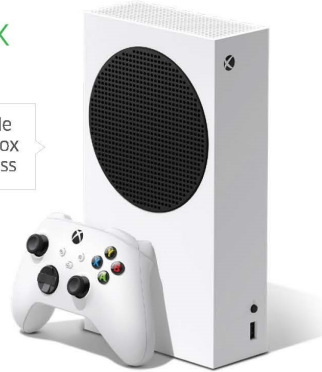

### **Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project**
