

Cemetery Regulations

We wish to express our sincerest thanks to families and friends who continue to generously donate to the Lakeview Cemetery. Commemorative Donations can be made at any time and will be put towards the continual beautification of the cemetery. Ongoing perpetual care donations are also accepted at anytime to help with the general upkeep of the plots where our loved one's rest.

In 2019 the Lakeview Cemetery Committee officially adopted a set of regulations regarding the control and operation of the cemetery. This Cemetery Bylaw sets out the general operating guidelines for the cemetery. The following guidelines apply in respect to flowers and other items place on a grave site:

- No cement slabs, grave covering, trees, or flower beds are permitted.
- All flowers must be placed into a vase or holder that is affixed to the monument.
- Placement of decorative items like solar lights and steppingstones must be placed to not interfere with grass cutting and maintenance.
- No unauthorized monument, bench or obstruction is permitted.
- Existing benches or obstruction shall be removed at the discretion of the Committee.

The Cemetery Committee has the authority to remove all floral designs, solar lights and other items that are located beyond the base of monuments. Maintenance staff provide a spring cleanup of all broken and discarded items, and we ask families to assist by helping us monitor the placement of these objects.

Contract Landscape Maintenance

The Lakeview Cemetery Operations Committee requires contract landscape maintenance within Lakeview Cemetery between the months of April 2022 and October 2022. This service contract will be for a one-year period and will include specific maintenance tasks including the supply of required tools and machinery.

Applicants are invited to submit a detailed proposal for the provision of services. Proposals will be accepted until April 15, 2022.

Chamber donates for new 'Jaws of Life'

The Chamber represents a wide variety of business, sole proprietors, and farm business' and as an organization we don't typically donate to sports groups or other organizations because our membership as a whole has already been approached.

During our March meeting one of the items on the agenda was a letter from the Macklin & District Fire Department looking for funds for their new Jaws of Life equipment. We had great discussion around the table about this project and how this state of the art equipment will benefit members of our community and beyond. A comment that stood out was "Look at how bad the roads have been this winter and how many bad storms we keep getting, if that's me inside a wrecked vehicle I want them to get me out as quickly as they can". It was voted on and passed that a \$5,000 donation from the Chamber of Commerce be given to this worthwhile project.

Ironically as the meeting was happening, and this specific item being discussed, our local firefighters were on their way to an accident south of Macklin and were using the current Jaws of Life equipment that will soon be replaced. We're very fortunate to have such a strong group of Volunteer Firefighters who drop everything when they get their calls to help those in a time of need.
