Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!

Dr. Eid Memorial Scholarship - Fund Windup & Distribution

Dr. Frederick Eid was a pioneering doctor in Macklin. He was born in 1896 in Germany and immigrated to Macklin in 1924. He served as doctor in this community for 44 years. Under Dr. Eid's leadership, the medical practice in Macklin rose from primitive pioneering to very sophisticated standards. He was a well renowned surgeon and kept up with the latest medical procedures of the time. After his death in 1968, his family set up a scholarship fund to help young people from the Macklin area, who were hoping to enter a profession in the medical field. Since 1971, the scholarship has given out \$71,450 in scholarships. The family now wishes to dissolve the Scholarship Fund and donate the remainder of the fund to the Macklin and District Health Foundation. The Foundation has agreed to use this money to continue to give out scholarships to worthy applicants in Dr. Eid's name. Applicants must meet the criteria set out by the Foundation.

It has been a privilege to assist so many young people in reaching their goals in the medical profession and we hope many more people will benefit from the remaining funds.

NEWS FROM THE FIRE HALL

Hey all I hope you are having a great spring so far.

I recently was asked by the Kinettes to help with the babysitter course they offer here in town. I was asked to cover what they should do if certain emergency situations would occur while they were babysitting. The students were very attentive and asked lots of good questions. After I was done there I thought, "I hope I helped get these future babysitters prepared for events they could have to deal with."

This article is aimed at helping the parents work with a new baby sitter, so that everyone knows what to do if they have to.

Number 1: Know that a baby sitter has the right to ask you if you have functioning smoke alarms and they can refuse to babysit if you do not. Number 2: It is a very good idea to give them a note that has emergency contact numbers and your address or land location. They should carry this with them in case they have to leave the house in a hurry. Number 3: Make sure they have access to a phone so they can call for help if they have to.

Number 4: Talk to them about you escape plan and where they are to go in case they have to leave the house.

Number 5: If the power goes out make sure they have access to a working flashlight. Solar lights out in the yard can be brought into the house as well if they can safely get to them. Candles are not recommended!! Number 6: Tell them where to take you children in the event of a major wind or hail storm.

Number 7: If they are working in the kitchen and around the stove make sure they are properly instructed. Most home fires start in the kitchen.

A quick conversation and sharing the above information will definitely get everyone on the same page so everyone is better prepared should something unexpected happen.

Thank you to the Kinettes for providing this course for the young baby sitters and for inviting us to help. We always enjoy talking to the kids. Thank you also to the Kinettes for the very generous donation to our new rescue tool project. They had pledged monies for the next three years and were able to give the total amount in one!!

We are still working towards paying for these tools. If you or anyone you know would like to help on this please contact myself or any member of Macklin & District Fire Rescue.


