
Changes coming to Macklin's Main Street

The Town of Macklin has been successful in obtaining a grant through Western Diversification Canada to demolish two dilapidated stores from the town's main street and replace them with a farmer's market space. Through the construction of an open community meeting space capable of hosting small outdoor community gatherings, this new space will revitalize the existing downtown core business area.

The scope of the project will include demolition of two existing buildings, construction of vendor and public gathering areas, landscaping, and site remediation. Through this project we will be improving the community infrastructure and encourage citizens to re-engage with local service providers. The Town of Macklin has partnered with the Macklin Chamber of Commerce, appointing individuals to oversee the project and guidelines for its operation.

Carbon Monoxide and Smoke Alarms - Protecting People in **Their Homes**

Information at a Glance

Effective July 1, 2022, all buildings in Saskatchewan with sleeping rooms are required to provide early warning protection against the effects of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, smoke and fire

installation of CO and smoke alarms is the most effective way of accomplishing this requirement.


When a building with sleeping rooms contains a fuel-burning appliance, or an attached vehicle parking garage, CO alarms must be installed:

- inside each sleeping room; OR
- outside each sleeping room within 5 meters (16 feet) of each sleeping room door

When a building contains sleeping rooms, smoke alarms must be installed:

- on each floor level of a building, including the level with sleeping rooms, with the smoke alarm located between the sleeping rooms and the remainder of the floor; AND
- inside each sleeping room.

An example house, that meets the new requirements for CO alarms and smoke alarms, is shown below

NEWS FROM THE FIRE HALL

Hello All!

I hope you are all having a great summer!! After the Bones Tournament it doesn't take long and the evenings start getting dark earlier. We sure have had to deal with a lot of hot weather the past 3 weeks. If you are working outside remember to keep hydrated and take lots of breaks in the shade. We have been very fortunate at the Hall (Touch wood) and have not had to respond to any major incidents while it has been so hot. The farmers are starting the harvest and the risk of fires always increases with all the big machines running and the hot dry weather. Please use extra care and make sure all your machines are greased and running smoothly!! We have a lot of farmers in the area now that take their water trucks, pro-tills or double discs to the fields they are working in. This is a great help to us and is much appreciated by the guys at the hall!! It always helps us when we are pulling up to a field fire and you see the locals already battling the blaze with the tools they have. Double discs and water trucks can do a lot in a short time. Remember if you have a water truck on scene we might ask you to fill our wildland trucks. Any kind of 2 or 3 inch hose/pump unit can be used to fill these units. If you are helping at these fires always be aware the risks and hazards you are dealing with. Wind direction and field conditions, washouts, sloughs, fences and power lines can all factor into how you fight these fires. Thank you to the farmers taking these extra precautions. Please use caution, care and common sense on any fire scene.

Many of you might already be aware of some changes in the Provincial Construction codes. These rules are effective as of July 1st of this year and apply to all buildings in Saskatchewan where people sleep. The new regulations require CO Detectors on every level of the house that has sleeping rooms and smoke detectors in every bedroom. Please see the advisory to the left. If you have any questions, please feel free to do some research on line or contact any member of the fire department!! Be safe out there, stay cool and have a safe fall season!!





Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been moving forward with the cemetery improvement plan as time and funds allow. Currently the concrete pilings for the stone pillars has been installed and initial landscaping is underway. The original entrance sign leading into the cemetery will be removed shortly and sent to Kohlman's Machine & Welding for repair, expansion, and powder-coating.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces available for sponsor-ship. There are 26 permanent stone pillars being constructed to support the wrought-iron perimeter fence. Through a donation of \$3,000 a commemorative plaque will be inlaid within a stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution towards this project.
