Main Street Construction Underway

As the weather warms work has begun on the sidewalk and roadwork program for the 2023 construction season. The crews will begin with removing all existing sidewalks in the downtown commercial section of Herald Street, between Globe Avenue and Press Avenue. This removal will be timed to accommodate the arrival of the concrete contractor who is set to arrive on site the first week of May. The concrete contractor will begin work on one side of the center median and once complete move to the opposite side; this will allow for one-way traffic flow on the opposite side of the street.



Work on the asphalt and base removal will begin on a timeline to be established by the Town Foreman and the track-hoe contractor. This will be a very busy section during the construction process, the Town of Macklin is requesting everyone cooperate and be mindful of the equipment, gravel trucks and contract operators. Please respect barricades and directional signs while patronizing our local businesses. Every effort will be made to accommodate access to businesses, however, there will be short periods of business interruption. Discussions have taken place with business owners and where possible alternate entrances may be used at various points during the construction.



The work in the business section is part of the larger 2023 construction program, this will encompass the section of Herald Street between Courier Avenue and Press Avenue. Once work is progressing in the business section crews will begin with sidewalk and street removal and replacement in other sections. This will impact traffic flow around Macklin School, when this takes place, please be mindful of construction signs and equipment. Contractors will try to schedule work to minimize school disruptions and provide a safe traffic flow for students. Updates on the construction schedule will be posted to the Town of Macklin Facebook page.

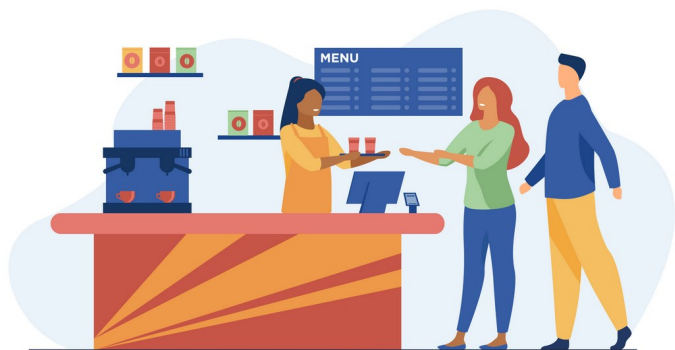

News from the Hall

Hi All from the Hall!!! I hope you are all getting over the slow arrival of spring. It will get here eventually. Please remember this is the time of year when the grass and stubble get very dry and grass or field fires can spread very quickly. It is very difficult to fight these types of fires in spring because the grass and straw dry out in the wind but the land can be very soft and muddy underneath. This makes it very difficult to get around with our trucks and getting stuck in the mud is not uncommon. It is very hard on our equipment to work in these conditions. It is not unusual to have people burning brush piles, sloughs and garbage pits this time of year as they want to get ready for summer. We have seen several times where there is a light wet snow in the morning and we are out chasing a grass fire 3 hours later when the sun comes out and the wind comes up. Please remember brush piles can burn for weeks and all it takes is a little wind gust on a sunny warm day and the fire will reignite. ALWAYS use caution and common sense when lighting fires. NEVER throw cigarettes out of your car. I just had a member tell me he was following someone who was doing exactly that. In my experience with our department, easily more than half the fires we respond to this time of year have been started by carelessly discarded cigarettes.

Also remember seeding will be starting very soon and you will see lots of big equipment moving on the roads. Please know that sometimes the operator of these machines might not be able to see you. Always use extreme caution when passing heavy equipment, especially at night as some of this stuff is very wide and the flashing light might not be on the very outside of the machine.

We also were asked by the Kinettes to assist with the Polar Plunge they did down at the lake. We hauled the water down to the lake and filled a big tank for them. (They wanted the water nice and cold) They then got thirty some brave souls to jump into this tank a couple days later. While the people were jumping into the tank we had four members there to make sure everyone got out safely. Thank you Justin, Terry, Cam and Cole for giving up your Saturday afternoon for this. The people who jumped in had taken pledges and this is how they raised money for Cystic Fibrosis. It's always fun to help out on new and unusual events. Way to go Kinettes! Lots of money raised for a good cause and we had fun at the dance as well!!

Be safe out there everyone and enjoy the Spring weather when it gets here. (It will eventually)

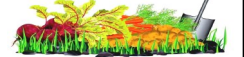
