

Next year, Prairie Sunset Music Festival will be held in Macklin from April 21st to 25th.





Recreational Vehicles



It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.

- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!

PROPERTY OWNER RESPONSIBILITY

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice. For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance. RCMP MACKLIN REPORT April 4-May 15, 2023

TUESDAY, JUNE 13, 2023

- RCMP received a complaint of uttering threats but there was insufficient evidence to proceed.
- Police received a request to keep the peace while an individual retrieved personal property from a residence. Members were attending a priority call and unable to assist at the requested time.

MACKLIN MEDICAL CLINIC—Cancellation, Late Arrival and No Show Policy

Cancelling your Appointment

It is important that you notify Macklin Medical Clinic staff in the event you are unable to make your appointment. This can be done at any time prior to your scheduled appointment and can be done by calling 306-753-2366 and informing the receptionist that you need to cancel. You can rebook for another date at this time if you wish.

No Show Policy

When you have scheduled an appointment to see a physician at Macklin Medical Clinic, it is expected, unless otherwise notified, you will attend your visit at the scheduled time. In the event that you do not attend your appointment and have not notified the clinic, you will be contacted by the clinic and informed that your appointment was missed and a letter outlining the policy will be mailed to you. In the event that you do not attend a second scheduled appointment within a 2 year span, you will receive in the mail an invoice for a \$30.00 No Show Assessment fee. If you wish to book an appointment following receipt of this invoice, you will be required to pay the No Show Assessment Fee **PRIOR** to being able to book an appointment at the clinic. You will need to pay in person at the receptionist's desk before an appointment will be made. If you continue to not show up for appointments following this, your physician may decide to terminate their relationship with you.

Please note that there are some exceptions that will apply, but this will be at the discretion of your physician.



If you cannot make your appointment or are going to be more than five minutes late, please call Macklin Medical Clinic at 306-753-2366 to notify the staff.

News from the Hall

Hey all. Happy Spring! I hope you are all enjoying the warmer weather and the longer hours of sunlight every day. Please remember it is very dry out yet and the risk for grass fires is still very high.

I have included some tips to help protect your property from these types of fires:

Dispose of matches and cigarettes properly. Never throw either out of a vehicle.

Making a fire break can slow a fire's progress. These can be areas that have been ploughed, mowed or even grazed. Keep your lawns cut and your gardens and yards well maintained.

Teach your children not to play with fires or matches. Do not use machines or tools that can cause sparks during dry conditions. Be extremely careful around campfires or back yard fires. Always wet down these areas and have a water supply or fire extinguisher nearby.

Never leave fires unattended and make sure they are properly extinguished before you leave them.

We are still meeting and training regularly at the hall. We have practiced drafting down at the lake. This means getting the trucks to pull water out of a water source and filling the trucks. We often use this when we are fighting grass or field fires. We have also practiced pump and roll which means spraying water from the trucks while they are moving. This is also a technique used to fight wildland fires.

That's all from the hall. Be safe out there everyne!! Have a great June!!

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been moving forward with the cemetery improvement plan as time and funds allow. Currently the concrete pilings for the stone pillars have been installed and initial landscaping is underway.
