
You may have noticed the beautiful banners displayed on the light posts along the highway and on Mainstreet. These banners honor our local veteran's.

## **Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Project** Only 2 Pillars Left!

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee has been moving forward with the cemetery improvement plan as time and funds allow. Currently the concrete pilings for the stone pillars have been installed and initial landscaping is underway. The original entrance sign leading into the cemetery has been repaired and installed in its new location.

The committee has decided to use the individual stone pillars as dedicated commemorative spaces available for sponsorship. There are 26 permanent stone pillars being constructed to support the wrought-iron perimeter fence. Through a donation of \$3,000 a

commemorative plaque will be inlaid within a stone pillar to forever recognize your contribution towards this project.

To date, 24 pillars have been purchased leaving the remaining 2 available. If you have been thinking about providing a donation to this project please don't delay, the last available pillars are available on a first come basis.

## **News from the Hall**

Hey all Hope you are all ready for November!!

Just an update since my last column. On September 28 Myrna and I travelled to Saskatoon. They had a ceremony there to honor first responders from all over the province who have served for 25 years. I was honored to receive the Saskatchewan Protective Services Metal from the Hon. Russell B. Mirasty Lieutenant Governor. It was a very simple event but it was an honor to sit with the other 41 recipients and receive these metals. It amazes me how quickly the last 25 years have gone by and what an honor it has been to work with all the past and present members of Macklin and District Fire Rescue and the Macklin and District Fire Board.

I would just like to share a few of the things I have learned over the past 25 years on our department: Fire Prevention Week with the students is always fun and educational. Kids think firefighters are cool! Sometimes your day (Or night) might not go as planned. Never drink and drive. NEVER text and drive, ever! I've learned that some people feel it is necessary to take pictures or video as they are passing an accident scene, instead of keeping their eyes on the road so they don't run over a first responder. (This is something I will never understand or accept) Somebody's bad day doesn't have to be a social media post. I've learned that the first time you drive a Rescue Van with light and sirens going it is pretty hard to control your adrenaline. Always have good, season appropriate tires. Always keep warm cloths and socks right beside your bed during the winter months. Check your smoke detectors and replace them every ten years. Install Carbon Monoxide Detectors Accidents and fires can, and often do happen on holidays or long weekends. Members of the Police Force are great people and they are just trying to help people stay safe. Life is precious!! Anyone is capable of incredible things. I've learned how to use the Jaws of Life and a bunch of other great tools that help us do what we need to do. How to hook up to a fire hydrant and pump water with many different trucks. Working together on a team can allow you to accomplish great tasks. Training and practice is very important but it cannot prepare you for every situation. Always have a Plan B and if necessary a Plan C and D. I've learned that sometimes you can't drive as fast as you would like because of a severe storm, heavy fog or extremely icy highways. I know it takes a long time to roll the doors up by hand if the power is out at the hall when you are going out on a call. It is important to have the love and support of your spouse and family. I know they are not sleeping if I go out on a call in the middle of the night until I get home. I've learned that going to a funeral for

a fallen firefighter is something you will never forget. I've learned the communication is very important when you are working as a team. I've learned that it can be very rewarding and satisfying to help someone who needs our help. I know I have the support of 20 plus individuals who will help me through an especially tough event. I know that I will be there for them too if they need it. I've learned that 25 years isn't a very long time if you are doing something you love. Stay safe everyone!!!


