Macklin Credit Union announces legacy

When it comes to bringing a community together, few places are as tied to gatherings as the local community hall, curling rink and arena.

Macklin Credit Union will contribute up to a maximum of \$1.5 million towards the completion of the paving project at the Communiplex. The project consists of paving the entire parking lot as well as areas around and between the buildings.

These funds were made available as a result of the merger with Synergy Credit Union and represents a portion of the equity accumulated by Macklin Credit Union over the past 80 years of operation.

“We are proud that Macklin Credit Union is able to contribute to this valued and much needed project in our community,” said Macklin Branch Manager Charlene Walz-Gette. “We know people in Macklin and surrounding communities will appreciate the improvement to the parking area.”

The hall was completed in 1990 and the Arena in 1997. It is with great pride, that on behalf of our members, we have made this contribution to the paving project which finally gives a finishing touch to the facilities.

In recognition of the contribution, the name of the Communiplex will be the Macklin Credit Union Centre.

It looks like summer is finally here. The forecast is for some HOT HOT weather. If you have to work outside (or play) please use proper precautions. Use sun screen, wear a hat and light colored clothes. If you are working make sure you get enough breaks to cool down and drink plenty of water. Heat exhaustion and heat stroke are very serious. Watch for signs of dizziness, headaches and extreme sweating or if you stop sweating. If you suspect you have been exposed to too much heat seek medical help immediately. Trust me on this one.

Summer is also a great time for fun on the lakes. If you are heading out this summer make sure your boat is working properly and has survived the nasty things old man winter can do to the motor etc. Always check the boat for oars and a bailing bucket. Make sure you have enough life jackets for all on board. Make sure the life jackets are CSA approved and rated for the weight of the person who wears it. One life jacket doesn't fit all. If you are water skiing, riding on tubes, knee boards or wake boards make sure you have a proper life jacket for this kind of activity. Make sure they fit tight and are properly strapped. A nasty spill can really test a life jacket and the person wearing it. If you are driving the boat always be aware of other boats, what they are towing and watch for people in the water. Drinking and boating do not mix. Drive sober!!

If you are camping just a friendly reminder to never leave a fire unattended and make sure it is out completely when you go to bed or leave the site.

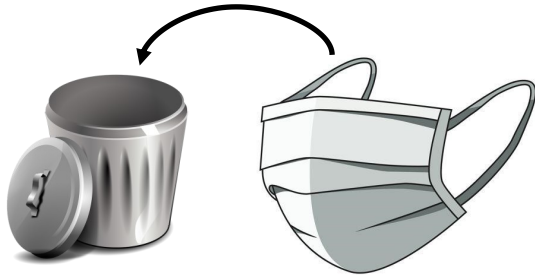

WASTE BUDGET COMPARISON

The Town of Macklin is committed to controlling the cost to our taxpayers and at the same time providing a dependable method of waste disposal. The WYWRA system provides a dependable and predictable system of waste disposal and recycling options. Recently inquiries have been made regarding the cost involved with having curbside tote pickup. These options are considered annually during budget preparation; to be fully transparent here is a cost comparison between our current system and a curbside tote collection system:

** Estimated cost for every residential address to have street collection of large plastic tote bins:

Waste pickup by contract company \$13.50/month with **bi-weekly** pickup (every second week)

Recycle pickup by contract company \$17.50/month with **bi-weekly** pickup (every second week)

Council also reviews the pro's and con's associated with a contractor supplied waste tote collection system.

Pro's

- Monthly fee could be collected through water billing structure and waste tags no longer required.
- Curbside tote pickup provides enclosed container protection from rodents and birds.
- Waste Collection truck would not be required.

Con's

- Cost would be placed on all residential water bills regardless the amount of garbage
- Proposal does not provide commercial pickup options
- All commercial properties are required to have overhead tip bins at additional fees.
- Contractor proposal monthly fees are estimated at current residential pickups, no ability for residents to provide their own disposal methods. (example: disposal at place of work)
- Contractor pickup is bi-weekly, for an additional fee this could be extended to weekly pickup
- Each tote holds 3-4 bags of garbage, is this enough for two weeks of waste?
- What about families with small children in diapers? Two weeks storage?
- What if a property has more than four bags of garbage every two weeks?
- Will this type of collection system be good for the elderly and for properties with steep front yards?
- Estimates do not address the cost of purchasing individual residential totes

The collection and disposal of waste and recycling materials is not an inexpensive operation. The Town of Macklin believes the current user pay tag system is a viable cost-effective option. Council further believes that our current system has promoted recycling by having free curbside pickup and by directly applying provincial grants to the collection of residential recyclables.

★ New Regulations for Recreational Vehicles

- It is **unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or trailer** (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for **no more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours** following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off-street location for a period of not less than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.
- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- **NO Extensions will be given.**
- **NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.**
- **Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!**



ATV Vehicles



The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP.

Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner.

Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP.

As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

Property Nuisance Bylaw

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice.

For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance.
