Letter from the Chief

Hello All,

Happy January. Blue Monday is past us and most of January is as well. Hopefully we are past the toughest part of this winter!!! The cold months always give the furnace a work out. Remember to get your furnace serviced regularly and change the filter as well.

A furnace that isn't working properly can cause deadly odorless gas to enter your home. Make sure you have a functioning Carbon monoxide alarm installed in your house. This is your best protection and gives you an early warning for what could be a very dangerous situation. Test yours and check for an expiration date on it. If your carbon monoxide detector alarms, get everyone out of the house and open some windows for ventilation. Call your gas company and they can test your air quality and advise you as to what to do. You can also call 911 as well. We have been called out for these on several occasions and have found faulty furnaces twice. Other times we found expired alarms or alarms that needed new batteries. Electric heaters and fireplaces also see increased use in cold weather. Always use common sense with these types of heaters and make sure nothing flammable is near them. Fireplace chimneys should be properly maintained as well as dangerous build ups can start in them and you could have a chimney fire.

Remember if you have ever thought of joining our department or have questions as to what is involved in what we do please feel free to contact me or any other member of our department. We could use some new members!!!

Town Bylaw 01/10 allows snowmobiles and ATV's to operate in Town limits Only for the purpose of exiting or entering the community. When entering or exiting the most direct route should be followed.

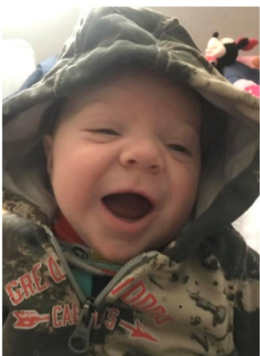

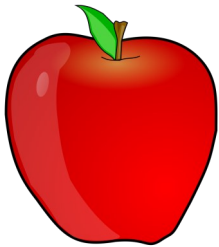

St. Valentine Love

We are now into February and the first thought for many — St. Valentine’s Day.

I may be wrong but I don’t think it is Saint Valentine, the saint revered in some Christian churches, that excites our hearts—more likely the parties, the fun, the laciest valentine we can find to give to our ‘bestest’ friend—the ‘love’ we buy in the Mall.

St. Valentine lived long ago for one purpose—to ‘do’ and to ‘spread’ kindness, expecting nothing in return—expecting nothing in return. That is Valentine love—and immediately comes to mind a Canadian soldier, Corporal Mark Isfeld, Nipawin, Sask.—and Izzy dolls.

The story of Izzy dolls begins circa 1990 when Cpl. Mark Isfeld (“Izzy”) was on his first peacekeeping mission to Croatia. Mark saw a child’s doll lying on a pile of rubble beside a bombed-out house in war-torn Croatia. This was but one evidence of all the horrors that children suffered during wartime; it was one that filled him with a personal fury about the suffering of innocent children and he agonized about what he could do to ease the horror.

In a letter to his mother he unburdened his concerns. His mother suggested small, soft dolls that soldiers could carry in their pockets and could easily be handed out while on their missions in these countries. And his mother, Carol, crocheted/knitted small, softly stuffed dolls, and sent them to Mark. While Mark and his colleagues were on their missions they distributed them to children. The children grabbed and hugged the dolls, the children were delighted. The soldiers say that sadly many of the children die and their dolls are buried with them or placed on top of their graves.

In 1994, while clearing landmines in Croatia, Mark was killed. After his death his troops asked Carol if she would continue sending Izzy dolls. Many friends and others across the country joined in. Later Carol posted the doll pattern on the Internet and the work-of-love spread and continues. These dolls go all over the world to bring a bit of joy to children suffering through the ravages of war, famine and disease. They were also sent to Africa as packing for medicine for AIDS orphans; one bright spot in many a child’s world.

A collection and distribution network was established across Canada with the assistance of The Canadian Engineers Association in Mark Isfeld’s memory.

Now Izzy dolls are going into ‘shoe boxes’ as well and are off to help bring a bit of joy to a lonely child somewhere in the world.

“Thank you, Mark (Izzy) Isfeld for the gift of St. Valentine love”.
