

Recreational Vehicles

It is unlawful to park any camper, boat trailer or any other trailer unit on any street or lane in town for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours when connected or disconnected from the towing vehicle. However, that in the case of a recreation type vehicle or trailer, out of town guest privileges may be granted by the Town Administrator for an extended period of time not exceeding forty-eight(48) hours. It is also against Town bylaws to park any vehicle on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles that will fall under the provisions of this bylaw should take the necessary steps as no further notice will be given before bylaw tickets are issued.

***NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.**

***Traffic Tickets will be placed on unit in violation!**

As we embraced the superhero theme, especially the Hulk, we also partnered with Macklin School to host the "Hulk" from the Saskatchewan Rush Lacrosse team along with dancer Laine Cosh. We took pictures, sold bracelets and the kids were able to "meet the Hulk", both there and later on at the event. Macklin School students also helped paint superhero cut-outs that were featured in our kids activity room for photo opportunities! Roger and Nikki (Nash's parents) shared what it was like to receive the devastating diagnosis about their son. They spoke about what it has been like to deal with the diagnosis and balancing the medical needs of Nash with the responsibility of his older brother as well. 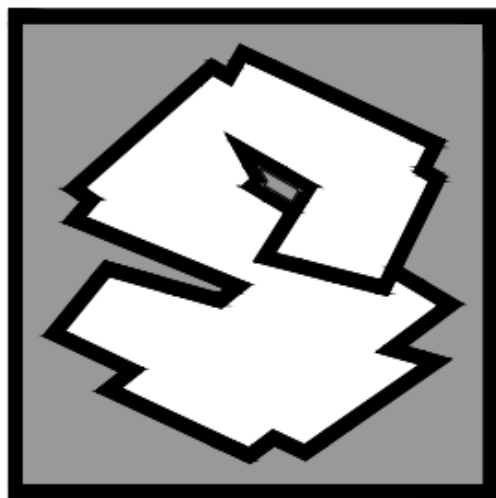

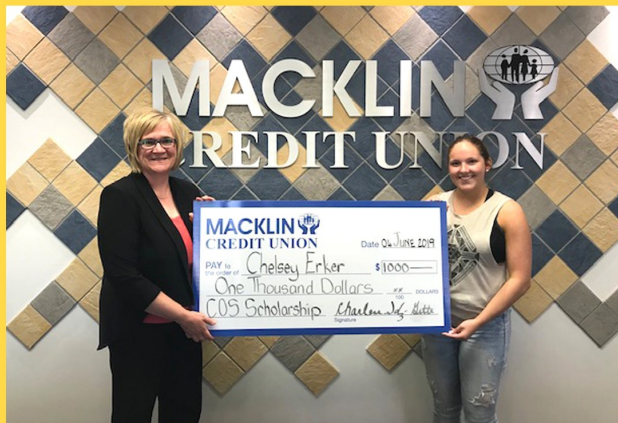

Letter from the Chief

Have you ever been driving on a highway and you see a vehicle in the other lane swerving and crossing the center line? What are your thoughts when you see a car coming towards you in your lane? What is this person doing? Are they on their phone? I have seen too many drivers doing this way too many times. I have about a ½ mile commute to work and it is very rare that I can get home without seeing someone on their phone. These drivers are approaching a major intersection of 2 busy highways. Is their phone really that important right now?

We were pulling our camper in central Alberta and we had a Jeep coming towards us. The vehicle had fully crossed the center line and we had to brake hard and pull over to the side of the road as far as we could. Luckily the driver looked up just in time and saw us. She had to do a hard swerve to get back into her lane. Her phone was clearly visible in her hand when she passed us as was the terrified look on her face. I have been a firefighter for 20 years and we have attended multiple single vehicle roll overs on straight stretches of highway on bright sunny days. What causes a car to enter a ditch at highway speed under these conditions??? Distracted drivers perhaps? I have visited to neighboring departments and talked to their Chief's. Some have attended car accidents where people were killed, evidence later showed that distracted driving was a direct factor in causing the collision. Studies show that you are TWENTY THREE TIMES more likely to be in a crash if you are texting and driving. In Saskatchewan on an average year there are over 7,600 crashes, 2,245 injuries and 46 deaths attributed to distracted driving.

The next time you reach for your phone while you're driving please say to yourself do I really want to increase my odds of getting in accident by 23 times?

Do I want to get in a life threatening event just to check a message? Texting and driving is killing people in our country, our province and our area. Please drive safe and have a good summer

It is what it is***by Susan Conly***

(I always welcome suggestions from my readers about topics for my articles. Recently I was asked by a friend to write an article on the much-used phrase ‘it is what it is’.)

How often have you, have I, used this phrase—‘it is what it is’?

This is a rather modern phrase compared to some sayings that date back centuries. “It is what it is” dates back only to the 1940s when J. E. Lawrence, Nebraska farm implement agent, facing harsh unbroken prairie, with agitated homesteaders impatiently milling about, wondered aloud, “. . .what to do? what to recommend to these men in such a harsh unforgiving land? ... it is what it is!”

And so it was—and this seems to have been the introduction of the phrase into our vocabularies. Have we misused it?

Far too often we associate it with hopeless misfortune. Life confronts us with some shattering news; immediately, enveloped by a dark, suffocating cloud of hopelessness, we cannot see beyond “it is what it is”. Overcome by a sense of impending doom, resentfully we accept “it is what it is”—just endure; don’t waste time mulling over something that can’t be changed. Frustration, hopelessness, often heart-wrenching sadness takes over our life. It is what it is.

Then Doris Day comes along with her popular song of the 1950s “que sera, sera, whatever will be, will be ...”, and we are given a new thought —is there not hope in those words ‘whatever will be, will be’? In the ‘whatever’?

Let’s not be too quick to accept that first negative reaction! Keep in mind that for any predicament— no matter how foreboding it appears to be at the moment— remember “the future’s not ours to see”— and the ‘whatever’ of the future is never final. Never final for those who remember ‘the future is not ours to see’ because God is in charge. “I (God) will never leave you nor forsake you”.

Recall His promise—and your faith!

“I am with you always to the end of time.” It is well to remember, too, that faith requires the possibility of rejection—or it is not faith. That “it is what it is” does not have the final say, is not irreversible, and God’s ‘whatever’ very well may include much struggle and pain. But any circumstance can be resolved in a most unexpected way when placed in God’s hands; tears are replaced by smiles. The unexpected resolving may be slow and difficult, often is, but Divine Love always finds a way.

Focus on this. Difficult times are growing times; “it is what it is”, is one more opportunity to grow in our trust. There is no way of knowing what each day will bring. God gives us a new beginning in every sunrise.

“It is what it is”—the “it” always in God’s hands—if we put it there!

Property Nuisance Bylaw

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice.

For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance.
