

Town of Macklin Public Notice – Zoning Bylaw Amendment

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Macklin intends to adopt a bylaw under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend Bylaw No. 03/14, known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

The proposed bylaw will:

- a) Provide a definition of a "Cannabis Retail Store".
- b) Establish a "Cannabis Retail Store" as a Discretionary Use in the C1-Town Centre Commercial District.
- C) Establish a "Cannabis Retail Store" as a Discretionary Use in the C2-Profile Highway Commercial District.

REASON

The proposed bylaw would provide the framework whereby an application to locate a "Cannabis Retail Store" will be considered for development.

I PUBLIC HEARING

Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, July 13, 2020 at 8:00 pm in the Town of Macklin Council Chambers – 5001 Press Avenue to hear any person or group who wishes to comment on the proposed bylaw. Council will also consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the Town office to the undersigned prior to the hearing.

The Macklin Rage U18 volleyball club team had a shortened season this year. The team consisted of all Macklin girls (Devyn Steinhubel, Emma King, Leah Weinkauf, Kylie Stupka, Amy Deck, Emma Stang, and Olivia Farkas) this season. The team had such a successful high school season and it made sense to try carry that success, into the club season. Practices and exhibition matches began in January. The teams first action was the Regina Stealth tournament held in North Battleford on February 1 st and 2nd . The team finished 5th out of 10 teams, not the start we had hoped for. Things improved the following weekend (February 8/9) our first Sask Cup 1, held in Saskatoon at the Henk Ruys soccer centre and at SaskTel Sports centre. The teams were seeded heading into the tournament. The girls were seeded in Division 2 Tier 1 at the start of Saturday. At the end of Sunday, the girls finished 7th in the province behind Regina Stealth, Saskatoon Huskies, Regina Cougars, P.A Toppers, Wascana Selects (Regina), and Swift Current Sundogs. So, the girls were in with some tough competition. Most of these teams have the top recruits for college and university teams leading them and all 17 -18 years old. Our little town made up of mostly 16- year-old players, with two 17-year old's (Devyn and Emma King) competed and competed well against all these teams. The girls had some very close matches.

The team had a few weeks off before the next Sask cup, so they played Provost (EVC) volleyball club an exhibition match in Macklin. The girls went undefeated all 5 sets against the U18 Provost team. This led us into our next Sask Cup 2 held in Lloydminster on March 7 th and 8th. This Sask Cup we were seeded 7 th and therefore played in Division 1 made up of the top 8 teams in the province. Lloydminster

for club has always proven difficult for our girls over the years, not sure why? We had one player injured from the first Sask cup in Saskatoon Kylie Stupka. This made things difficult when you carry only 7 players on your roster. Kylie did start in her traditional position on the left side power position. This was creating physical distress for her, so she was moved to another position. Amy Deck played power for the weekend. We struggled the whole weekend and eventually finished 8th. When you play consistently good teams, that height averages six feet plus, it takes its toll mentally. So, we had another couple of weeks off and were seeded 8th for the next Sask Cup 3 to be held in Yorkton on March 28th and 29th. We all know what happened on March 19th . So, our last time together as a team was the Lloydminster Sask cup 2. It was a huge let down, especially for our two older girls. I feel like we had some unfinished business and didn't have a proper end to our seasons. We will lose Emma King and Devyn Steinhubel (Pictures right) next season for both High school and club. These two have been instrumental in our successful past several seasons. We wish them all the best and will miss them dearly. This club volleyball team could not have competed this season, without the support of our community and local businesses. Thank you to the Macklin Credit Union, Double V farms, Macklin Rona, Steelview, Macklin Kinettes, Prairie Moon, Macklin Coop, Farkas Farms and the Living Sky School Division (Facilities) for your support this season. 



New Regulations for

Recreational Vehicles

- It is <u>unlawful to park any recreational vehicle or</u> <u>trailer</u> (attached or unattached) of any type whatsoever on any public street or lane in the Town of Macklin for <u>no more than forty-eight (48) consecu-</u> <u>tive hours</u> following which the owner or operator shall move the recreational vehicle or trailer to an off -street location for a period of not less than fortyeight (48) consecutive hours before the recreational vehicle or trailer may be parked again on a residential street.
- No recreational vehicle shall have any slide extension opened while on any public street as outlined in Section 11(b) for a period longer than three (3) hours.
- NO Extensions will be given.
- NO Warnings will be issued and violations will be enforced immediately.
- Traffic Tickets will be placed on the unit in violation!



ATV Vehicles



The use of All Terrain Vehicles is covered under legislation passed by the Province of Saskatchewan and violations of this act are enforced by the local RCMP. Persons owning and operating any quad, motor bike or other ATV should know what is permitted under this piece of legislation. Please contact any member of the RCMP by calling 753-2171 to discuss your rights as a property owner or ATV owner.

Complaints under the All-Terrain Vehicles Act should be directed to the RCMP.

As responsible vehicle owners please respect the rights of private property owners and members of this community. Violations may be issued for excessive noise, intrusion onto private property or any other violation covered under the above mentioned legislation.

Property Nuisance Bylaw

The Town of Macklin has a bylaw that provides authority to regulate and enforce the care and maintenance of your private yard. If your property is adversely affecting the health or safety of your neighborhood or is interfering with your neighbor's enjoyment of their property you may be in contravention of this bylaw. Annually the bylaw section dealing with overgrown grass and weeds as well as general yard maintenance is a large source of complaints to the town office. It is your responsibility to ensure your property is neatly cared for; this includes the boulevard adjacent to your property. Grass and weeds should be maintained regularly, and trees/hedges should not be overhanging the sidewalks.

The Town of Macklin has the authority to inspect your property, deem it to be untidy and order you to remedy all items listed in a written order. Should the items listed in the order not be corrected in the time provided, seven days, the Town of Macklin will hire a contractor to complete the work required. All fees and charges associated with the ordered work will be invoiced back to you the property owner; if this invoice remains unpaid it will be added to and be collected with your annual property tax invoice.

For the benefit of the whole community take care of your property; it will allow everyone to enjoy a clean and safe community environment. The enforcement provisions outlined in the Nuisance Bylaw are there to promote community pride and are considered discretionary enforcement tools for compliance. Alliance Pipeline Aquatic Centre

Alliance Pipeline Aquatic Centre is pleased to announce that we will be opening for the season! Our **target opening date is July 6**. Dedicated board members have already started working to get the pool emptied so cleaning and filling can begin later this week. There is additional work to get the facility and staff ready to open under COVID-19 restrictions set out by the Government of Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Health Authority.

We look forward to the community's support and understanding as we navigate the realities of opening this season. We hope to see people out for some much-needed recreation! Please understand that there will be some changes in the way things are done this year. Some things to expect:

-Lessons for all preschool and up to and including Level 2 will be parent-assisted - as required by Red Cross. This allows for physical distancing from the instructor, while keeping the safety of the child in mind.

-Please do not arrive more than 5 minutes before your lesson or public swimming. Staff will be cleaning in between sessions and doors will be locked.

-There will be <u>no</u> season passes this year. We encourage the use of punch cards. We will honour any punch cards purchased this year next summer as well.

-Maximum capacity has been set at 80 people (including those in the water and on the grass). This may mean a waiting line for those wishing to get in.

-Directional arrows will be visible throughout the facility to help with the flow of traffic. An entrance and an exit door will be marked. -Hand sanitizer will be provided and patrons are required to use it when entering the facility.

-Patrons are encouraged to arrive in their swimming clothes. Lockers will <u>not</u> be available this year so personal items must be taken out on deck with you.

-Patrons are required to shower before entering the pool, but showers will <u>not</u> be available after swimming. Washrooms will be accessible during your visit by going through the main lobby and into the washroom.

-Physical distancing (2 metres) between family groups is required throughout the facility, including the pool and grass area. -Please bring your own chair. Due to COVID-19 disinfecting requirements chairs will not be provided. Picnic tables will still be available and will be disinfected throughout the day.

-Goggle rentals are <u>not</u> available; goggles will be available for sale.

-Lifejacket rentals WILL be available.

-There will be <u>no</u> concession items available. Please bring your own snacks and water.

-Brochures will <u>not</u> be available for handout this year so please check the website for times.



Macklin Sabres - 2017 Defensive Most Outstanding Player & 2018 Defensive Most Outstanding Player


