#### **Recreational Vehicles**



It is unlawful to park any camper, boat trailer or any other trailer unit on any street or lane in town for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours when connected or disconnected from the towing vehicle. However, that in the case of a recreation type vehicle or trailer, out of town guest privileges may be granted by the Town Administrator for an extended period of time not exceeding forty-eight(48) hours. It is also against Town bylaws to park any vehicle on any public park or boulevard within Town limits at any time. Those individuals having campers and vehicles that will fall under the provisions of this bylaw should take the necessary steps as no further notice will be given before bylaw tickets are issued.

#### Command Chief of the Royal Canadian Navy attends Sir Max Aitkin Annual Ceremonial Review



Connor Cosh a Grade 12 student played in the Football Sask Senior Bowl on Sunday May  $26^{th}$  @ Mosaic Stadium. Only graduating students are eligible for the Senior Bowl, and the NORTH team tryouts were in Saskatoon May 11-12. Depending on the style of football your high school plays is the team you tryout for  $\sim$  6 man, 9 man, or 12 man.

Connor has been playing 6 man style football in Macklin since Grade 7 but also has experience playing 12 man for 3 years with the Lloydminster Red Dogs (Spring football Feb-May). Connor has said that 6 man is a harder game to play than 12 and it makes you a more well rounded player. In 6 man and if you mess up some-

thing big is typically going to happen whereas with 12 man if you mess up there's always someone close by to cover you. Sr Bowl practices were on Friday May 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> and the big game vs the SOUTH was on Sunday. The North dominated the entire game and beat the South 78-14 breaking a scoring record. Only 18 boys made the up the team and some of the other towns representing the NORTH were: Wakaw, Hanley, Clavet, Rosthern, Hague, Carrot River, Viscount, and Aberdeen. At the Saturday night awards ceremony Connor received the Nomination for top Linebacker of the Sr bowl. (Winner has yet to be announced). A quote from a CanAm coach/scout in the stands was "Connor looked really good today. Great position, solid tackling, and the interception was a nice exclamation point on his game".

Connor will find out in the next couple of weeks if he had made the roster for the CanAm bowl with will be held in Wakaw July 2<sup>nd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>. That again is a 6man style game and is the Canadians vs Americans.





#### A Daily Promise

I am an early morning walker.

"Why walk so early?" Sometimes the question is asked in wonder; sometimes quite critically; the answer is simple--it is the best time of the day.

When on the farm, as I walked, I often thought of another early morning walker, Grandpa Alex Conly, who early one spring morning in 1910 began his walk across the Prairie from Evesham to Battleford, over 100 miles—no fences, no roads—to register this land for his homestead, SW18-39-26-W3rd, —"This land I'm walking on this morning!"

Many other long-ago fathers walked similar miles in those beginning years, building our province.

During my many years on the farm, while I walked this old pasture fence-line the eastern sky often glowed with the promise of a new day. Grass heavy with dew, robin calling, tentatively, checking who else was awake; answer from the pasture fence-post—meadowlark was up, too. In season, crocuses blossoming in profusion, little calves over in the shaded hollow beginning to stir, a deer on the hillside watching. Bird songs grew louder, the glow in the east brightened, the promise of a new day. Special times one cherishes on the farm. Any clear morning-sky of the year, I watched day's leisurely coming; 'leisurely' as though urging us all to slow down.

Sunrise is never hurried.

I still I enjoy my morning walk—not now in Grandpa Alec's pasture— but in the Villa Marie Park. Again, this Fathers' Day, you and I will remember with gratitude those fathers walking early, building homesteads. I recall a doctor friend once saying that the most important element in organizing your day was "the early morning, an unhurried time as you begin your day. Start your day on the run, and you never catch up." Then he went on to say, "more nerves are frayed, more duodena are ulcerated by eating breakfast on the run, than by any other factor."

Maybe it would be well to remember this, and in spite of all our frantic rushing about, sunrise, clear or clouded, ever since the day of creation, comes slowly. Time to remember that yesterday is history. Each new sunrise is a clean, fresh opportunity to get on with life.

The invitation is there with every dawn, every season. The invitation to discard the hurts and defeats of yesterday; to cherish the triumphs, to build on achievements. And most of all, the invitation to plan another day, quietly, prayerfully. Henry David Thoreau, famous essayist, poet, "An early morning walk is a blessing for the day."

Sun is now fully up. A whole new day has dawned, full of promise, instinctively I say, "thank you, God, for this new day that never was before" --and I saw its creation.

That's a good enough reason, I think, to be an early morning walker.
