MACKLIN RECYCLING PROGRAM



With a single stream program, all recyclable materials can be co-mingled within the same recycling bag. No sorting or separating is required. Any color of CLEAR plastic bag (30x36, max 44lb) is acceptable.

Plastic:



All household plastics labeled with any (#1 - #7) symbol, Containers must have a numbered arrow symbol in order to be recycled. Some examples include: water bottles, shampoo bottles, liquid detergent jugs, milk jugs/cartons, juice boxes and all tetra pak containers, pop/water bottles, vinegar bottles, yogurt and margarine containers, windshield washer fluid jugs, etc.

*Plastic **not** accepted: Styrofoam, plastic toys, Tupperware, plastic pipe, outdoor lawn furniture, and all containers without the recycle symbol (#1 - #7).*

Metal :

Metal items must be completely rinsed which includes aluminum cans, pop/beer cans, trays pie plates and foil.

*Metal items **not** accepted include: wire hangers, propane tanks, batteries, auto parts, hazardous chemical containers. Also not accepted are glass bottles and jars.*

Paper Fiber Materials:

(paper, cardboard, paperboard) Items accepted include:

*Newsprint, flyers, junk mail and envelopes (with or without the window)

*Copy paper and computer printouts

*Shredded paper (please place in clear plastic bag and tie shut)

*Non-metallic gift wrap and packing paper *Magazines, catalogues, paperback books, telephone books *Hardcover books (cover and spine must be removed) *Paper egg cartons *Brown paper bags *Tissue and paper towel cores *Flattened cardboard and paperboard boxes

*Paper **not** accepted: any fiber material that is waxed or plasticized; any material that is food contaminated (ie: used pizza box with cheese stuck to it); soiled tissues, napkins and paper towels; confetti paper; heavily dyed or coloured construction paper.*

Clothes and glass jars are not recyclable items!

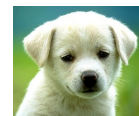

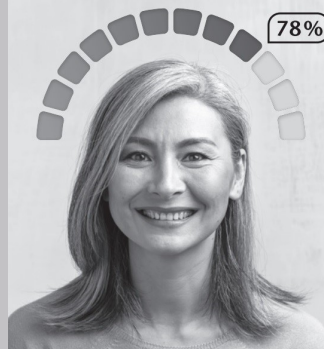

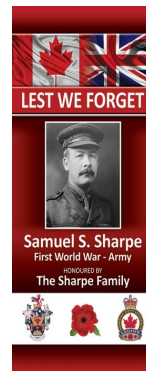
VETERAN MEMORIAL BANNER PROGRAM

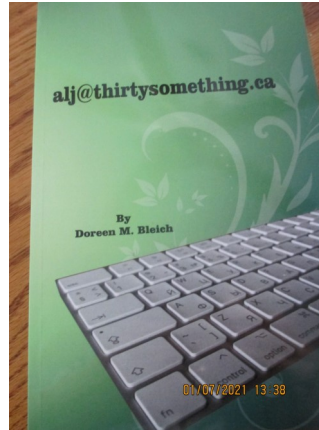
Local Author's New Book

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery New Entrance Project

The Macklin Lakeview Cemetery Committee desires to undertake a capital project to aesthetically improve the entrance into the cemetery. The project being considered will include the relocation and upgrade of the historic entrance gates to the cemetery. These memorial gates were constructed in 1953 and featured stone pillars, iron gates and an arched sign display. The evolution of road maintenance equipment and passenger vehicles rendered the entrance too small and the gates unusable for more than a decade.

It is the desire of the Lakeview Cemetery Operations Committee to reinvent and relocate the entrance. The entrance will be relocated to the east boundary opening and will include modern stone pillars to support the restored historic arched iron gates. Every attempt possible will be undertaken to try and relocate the existing stone pillars to a suitable location within the cemetery.

As funds will allow the completed project will incorporate a stone pillar and wrought iron fence along the complete east boundary of the cemetery property. This legacy project is a continuation of the cemetery beautification initiative project that has been ongoing for the past number of years. At this moment we are canvassing for donations towards the project and look forward to seeing this worthwhile project completed. The Lakeview Cemetery is a community space that demonstrates our commitment to respectfully commemorate those that have been laid to rest.

Letter From The Chief

What does it mean to be the Fire Chief on a Volunteer Fire Department???

Entering my 25th year with the Macklin Fire Department I do not think that I could have encapsulated the meaning in any better way than the former Chief, Pat Stang did. He covered every base, very well said Pat.

I want to take this time to thank you for your dedication, leadership and most of all time that you have given to our organization. Pat and I have had very similar paths through the department. First fireman, then Deputy Chief, then Chief, then back to fireman or Captain. OH, then back to Chief!

Just a little about my journey. Joined in 1996 as a fireman, was elected to Deputy Chief in 2001 and stayed in that position until 2006. When Don Stang stepped down as Chief I was elected as Chief in 2007 and held that position until 2014 when I asked to step down. I then handed the reins over to Pat, and stepped back to a Captain role and firefighter. I needed it...I was burnt out and considering leaving the department. What they don't tell you is how

invested you get into it, you love it, you live it, you breathe it. Now here we are 6 years later, rested and ready to really get back into it, our department sought fit to re-elect me back into the Chiefs role.

As we move into the next decade, first thing I have been tasked with doing is coming up with a new 10 year plan. The last one I did was in 2009 and came to pass in 2019. It's scary how close to accurate it was. That is a testament to the Fire Board for buying into the plan and making it happen. How do you look 10 and 20 years into the future for our community and plan and finance for that.....time will tell. Nothing is free or cheap in the world of emergency services.

One thing I wanted to share with you as I am not sure you may have seen it, is our Fire Departments mission statement, it is as follows: "The Macklin & District Fire Protection Board strives to provide through the functions of the Macklin and District Volunteer Fire Department, the services of Public Education, Fire Prevention, Fire Suppression and Rescue Operations to the citizens they serve, to the best of their abilities within the limitations of equipment and training."

The above is the mantra that we operate under.

Are we meeting the mission statement....I hope so.

I wish to take this time to thank our Volunteer members for the time, commitment and professionalism they bring every time they are needed. Thanks to their families and significant others for allowing them to commit to this organization. As Pat has said before, we are a very diverse group. It is not an old boys club, we have had females on the team. We have members that vary in age with over 30 years difference in age. If you are at all interested in doing something in the community, we can use a few more members. Please get in contact with a member or come to a meeting.

In closing, I wish everyone well. I hope we see things return to some semblance of normal in 2021. Pat has agreed in his new role as Captain, as the Public Relations, Safety and Recruitment officer, to continue to write each month about the goings on within the department. As I said, he does a good job!

PUBLIC NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Macklin intends to adopt a bylaw under *the Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend Bylaw No. 02/14 known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

The proposed bylaw amendment is intended to:
 Replace the definition for 'Live/Work Residential Acreage';
 Update development standards for Home Occupations;
 Create new development standards for Live/Work Residential Acreage Businesses;
 Update the development standards within the RA - Live/Work Residential Acreage District; and,
 Rezone a portion of lands legally described as Blk/Par B-Plan G877, and all of lots legally described as Blk/Par D-Plan 101901934 and Blk/Par E-Plan 102084566 from C2 – Highway Commercial, FUD – Future Urban Development, and CS – Community Service, respectively, to RA – Live/Work Residential Development, as shown within the bold dashed line on Map "A" below.

REASON

The reason for the amendment is:

- To accommodate commercial uses on large residential acreage sites within the Town of Macklin.
- To provide clarity in the bylaw.

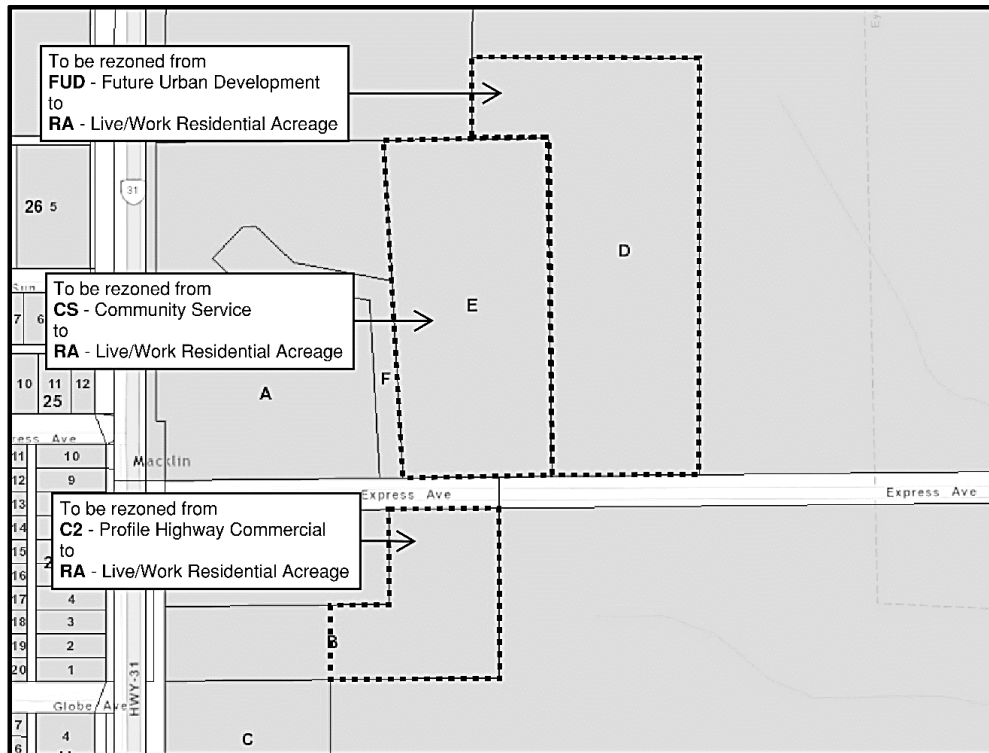
PUBLIC INSPECTION

Any person may inspect the bylaw at the Town Office, located at 5001 Press Avenue, in the Town of Macklin, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM (closed between 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM) on Monday to Friday excluding statutory holidays. Copies of the proposed bylaws are available online at www.macklin.ca.

PUBLIC HEARING

Council will hold a public hearing on March 22nd, 2021 at 8:00 p.m. in the Town Office. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, written submissions to Council pertaining to this bylaw are strongly encouraged. Written submissions must be received by email before March 19th, 2021 at 5:00 pm. Anyone wishing to make a verbal submission to Council must do so by phone. Please contact the Town Office at 306-753-2256 by March 19th, 2021 at 5:00 pm to schedule a time slot in which Council will phone you directly to hear your concerns or suggestions.

RCMP MACKLIN REPORT - Jan 12—Feb 11
