

Press Avenue Water and Sewer Project Update

With the 2018 construction season ending; Phase I of the Press Avenue Water and Sewer Upgrade project is nearing completion. Over the past number of months crews have worked to replace the old cast iron water mains and dilapidated manholes. A new sewer main was installed to expand flow capacity along Press Avenue exiting into the town's lagoon system. It is anticipated that the installation of sub-base and base material for the road reconstruction will be completed by the end of September.

A dust proof seal coat will be sprayed, after the final base gravel is in place, to secure the road over the winter months allowing traffic flow to return to normal. The tendering process for the installation of curb/gutter and asphalt surfacing will be initiated through the winter months with work to commence immediately in the spring of 2019. The Town of Macklin would like to thank residents for their patience during this important infrastructure project.

It is very important that you all know where to go once you are out. That way when we get there, all will be accounted for and we don't have to worry about missing family members. Some recent studies have shown than houses burn quicker and hotter now because of new types of furniture. This means you may have as little as one to three minutes to escape once the alarms sound. This is why it is so important to make sure everything is working and that you have practiced your plan!!! Do it today!!



The Catholic women's League resumed their meetings on September 4th after a summer break. A Fall Exchange of garden produce and home made products


was held after the meeting with 19 women in attendance.

RCMP – Macklin Report – Aug 21 – Sept 17, 2018

• RCMP received a report of a vehicle on fire in a field south of Macklin. The fire was not suspicious in nature.

• Police received a complaint of an individual throwing garbage into a residence yard. Members spoke to the subject of complaint and issued a verbal warning.

• Members spoke to an individual regarding a child welfare concern.

• RCMP received several complaints of theft from a motor vehicle. These matters are still under investigation. Police would like to remind residents to lock vehicles and remove keys and other valuables from inside the vehicle.

• Police received a report of a deceased male in a vehicle. Members attended and discovered the individual was just sleeping in his vehicle.

- Members spoke with two individuals about child custody issues.
- Members conducted a wellbeing check at the request of a neighbor.
- RCMP spoke to an individual regarding a safety plan

• RCMP received a request from the R. M of Eye Hill to have a trailer removed from a location in Primate. Members spoke with the registered owner who agreed to move it.

- Police received a complaint of fraud. This matter is still under investigation.
- Members are investigating a report of damage to a vehicle.

• RCMP attended a skid steer accident near Primate. The vehicle driver was injured and had been taken to Provost Hospital by a bystander. No charges were laid.

• Police would like to remind vehicle drivers to be vigilant while driving past the Macklin School on Herald Street during bus arrival and departure times. Vehicles are NOT permitted to pass buses in EITHER direction when buses have stop signs and lights activated. Drivers failing to obey this traffic law may receive a traffic fine of \$360.00.

• RCMP received a report of an individual shining a flashlight into residence back yards. Members patrolled but could not locate the subject of complaint.

• Members attended a single vehicle collision on Highway 31 near Primate. The vehicle driver sustained minor injuries and was transported to Provost Hospital by Emergency Medical Services.

LET THIS BE A DIFFERENT CHRISTMAS!

Only October, much, much too early to think of Christmas??...I think not. Too many already at the Mall, gift shopping in mind.

Christmas, 2000 years ago, happened in one of history's ugliest times— a world of cruelty many of us cannot begin to imagine. Behind all the Christmas tinsel of 2018 still lurks like horrors of 2000 years ago. We may be able to forget this as we franticly over-spend in the Mall but the fleeing refugees living in daily terror know, the starving homeless orphans, 2018, know; mothers and fathers watching the butchery of their babies and children know; the soldier dying a slow and horrible death in his prison cell knows.

So what was the point of that first Christmas? What is the point of Christmas 2018? Those horrors are still with us, daily increasing.

But let's remember that Jesus' birth was for one reason only— God's hope for His world. To this end God intended Him to be the center of my life and yours—is He? Too many have ignored His gift. Jesus, is not the center of lives, the 'Mall' is.

This reality leaves no doubt as to the world's future.

By His birth God brought us away from the 'shall nots' of our ancestors in the Old Testament, from all those harsh laws which for centuries did not work. It'll be the best gift you'll ever give--and it's 'love', not dollars, you're spending. And maybe you'll eventually enlighten us slow-learning adults as to what 'Christmas' is really all about.

Let us not mock God and His gift.
