Commemorative Benches available at Lakeview Cemetery

Macklin Lakeview Cemetery is developing a Columbarium section. Included with the design is the installation of 5 granite benches that will be permanently installed for use by visitors. These granite benches have been constructed to allow for memorial plaques to be permanently attached.

The Lakeview Cemetery Committee wishes to make these memorial benches available to families wishing to have a long-lasting commemoration for their loved ones. There will only be five of these benches, so the committee has decided to make them available for purchase proposals on a limited time basis. If more applications for purchase are received than the available benches a lottery selection will be used to determine the approved proposals.

Each commemorative bench is valued at \$1,000.00 which includes installation and a bronze dedication plaque. The bronze plaque is 3' x 18' and can accommodate three lines of text. To submit a

To Start out we had two strong house teams until the middle of June then made one team with 11 boys with a provincial banner in mind.



Wow another successful Bunnock championship is complete so let's reflect on what this weekend means to our community. This event has put Macklin on the map worldwide and the economic impact for our local businesses is staggering. We have estimated approximately 1,000 volunteers contribute their time, certainly some more than others, towards making this event possible. Without the volunteers committing their time, energy and expertise we could not even begin to start planning for next year. So firstly, hats off to anyone who gives of their time in any manner to make this weekend happen.

Secondly, it remains a priority with the Bunnock Committee that all profits remain in our extended community and benefit the non-profit organizations. It is for this reason all food and beverage concession providers during the tournament are associated with a non-profit organization. It is these non-profit groups that hustle many volunteers into action; so, a big thank you to all the groups that operate these activities during the tournament.

Annually this tournament draws approximately 3,500 people many of which travel great distances to attend. The Macklin Lake Regional Park campground is for most a destination for the weekend. It is a huge undertaking for the park staff to prepare for the weekend and then run in survival mode for the duration of the tournament. Thanks go out to the park staff for doing their best to make all our visitors feel welcome and for maintaining services during the event. Ensuring the safety of everyone on this weekend is a very serious undertaking. We continue to partner

with the RCMP and have hired a private security firm to assist over the last number of years. This has proven very effective considering the wide variety of age groups participating in the tournament. So, to everyone that makes the campsites their home on this weekend we thank you for your cooperation and for being ambassadors for our community.

Jim and I are Prairie people, familiar with gently rolling hills, little streams that chuckle across the pasture in springtime, far-stretching unbroken plains and the boundless horizons that give us our Prairie perspective.

In the summer of 1995 (24 years ago!!) we planned a tour through some of the U.S. National Parks and the Grand Canyon was high on our list of expectations and in order to appreciate it we did our homework. We read books and brochures, we knew all the statistics. Confident, we knew what to expect — we were ready for the Grand Canyon.

But the reality defied our imaginations.

Suddenly, dramatically, it opened before us, this 27.7 mile-long, mile-deep gorge; 18 miles wide, with the Colorado River far below, still snaking and slicing its pathway through solid rocks as it has been doing for some 20 million years. Its phenomenal abyss far below, could barely be seen from the Canyon rim but later as we flew over the Canyon in a Twin Engine Viscount, ("Canadian Made" or I would never, ever have been brave enough to take that flight!) we could see its magnificent panoramic sweep of breathtaking beauty; it was awesome.

Terra cotta Canyon walls, the rushing river far below, and off in the distance the labyrinth of giant coral-pink buttes, the gigantic pinnacles and spires still being sculpt and carved by weather.

Scientists still don't entirely comprehend the 1.5 billion-year history of the Canyon; it's a story of erosion that has created one of the most breathtaking sites in America.

Billions and billions of years of geological time exposed in a rainbow of ever-changing colours. My mind could not encompass the drama of over-whelming power or of all the elemental forces displayed in this on-going creation. Only a God of drama could stage a show like this!
