



IMPORTANT PLEBISITE NOTICE Cannabis Retail Outlet

In April 2020, the Province of Saskatchewan removed the 2,500-person population threshold from the Cannabis retail outlet guidelines. Applications can now be made to the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority (SLGA) for permits in communities less than 2,500 populations. The supply of cannabis for permitted retailers will continue to come from permitted wholesalers and federally licensed producers registered in Saskatchewan. Applicants will need to meet local municipal requirements including zoning.

The Council for the Town of Macklin began to have active discussions on how to proceed with any potential Development Permit applications. **Currently the Town of Macklin does not have any active applications for a Cannabis Retail store.** However, draft Zoning Bylaw changes were presented for community discussion at a Public Meeting held July 13, 2020. Communities may opt out of having cannabis retail stores in their community and Council felt unsure about deciding on behalf of the community.

Following the public meeting Council requested Administration to prepare a plebiscite question to be used during the 2020 civic election proceedings. Under Section 130 of *The Municipalities Act*, Council may submit to a vote any matter that the Council determines affects the residents of the community. A plebiscite vote does not bind the Council to action but is intended to provide Council with direction based upon most community residents.

The question that will be asked on the ballot is:

Resolution No. 1:

That the Town of Macklin permit the operation of a legal cannabis retail store and amend the Zoning Bylaw in areas zoned for commercial business:

_____ YES

____ NO

If you vote "Yes" to the above question, you may vote to clarify your location preference:

_____ Yes, in all commercial areas of the community.

_____ Yes, but only in the north commercial and industrial areas

This vote shall be conducted in accordance with The Local Government Election Act; therefore in order to vote you must meet the following qualifications:

Municipal Electors:

5. On the day of the election you must:

- (1) Be a Canadian Citizen
- (2) Be the full age of 18 years;
- (3) Have resided for at least three months in, or on land now in, the Town of Macklin; Or;
 - Have been the owner for at least three months of assessable land situated in the Town of Macklin;
- (4) Have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six months.

As is customary in all municipal elections, there will be an advance poll and a voting day approved by Council. This voting day may not happen sooner than eight weeks from the posting of this notice. There will be further public notice as dates and times are established.
