

Letter from the Chief

Hello Everyone!

Whhhhaaaaahhhooooooo! The cold snap is finally over! (For now) That was a long stretch. Every night the firefighters were going to bed thinking please don't let there be a fire tonight. Pumping water when it is extremely cold is difficult, dangerous and hard on equipment and firefighters!! Thankfully we got through it with no fires. The fire risk is always higher during cold weather because the increased use of space heaters, block heaters etc. Welcome spring!! With that being said remember to be careful around ice and fast flowing water as the conditions can change very quickly now. Please keep an eye on the young ones when they are out playing near water. The ditches also tend to dry out very quickly and cigarettes carelessly deposed of can start fires very easily.

Justin and Stephen attended an ICS100 course in February. This is a course on how to handle incidents when multiple agencies are responding and how to coordinate everyone on these scenes. Elliott Cline and I attended a 2 day course on grassland and wildland fires. This course was designed especially for areas like ours and because of the grass fire at Burstall grass in 2017. A volunteer firefighter was killed there when he got involved in an accident due to the heavy smoke conditions that day. It was a very worthwhile course and it is good to know what resources are available to us for these kind of incidents.

Remember we have room at the hall for some new members. If you have ever thought about coming out and joining a dedicated group of volunteers ,please feel free to contact me or any other member of our department.

How to fix your toilet:


The flapper is the most common cause of running toilets.


Take the lid off the back of the toilet and see if the flapper is all the way down against the valve seat or if it is hanging open.

If it is hanging open, try moving the arm that is attached to the flapper and see if it falls back down to the bottom of the tank. Check to see if anything is blocking the flapper from returning to the bottom such as the chain or sediment. If so, remove the impediments.

If it continues to leak, try replacing the flapper.







A slower leak can be more difficult to identify and can be caused by the valve seat being damaged. The best way to fix this leak is to replace the valve seat.

If your toilet is new, it may be leaking too. Take the leaky toilet test and see!

Directions:

- Remove the tank cover and put food coloring in the tank
- 2. DO NOT FLUSH
- Wait 30 minutes.
- 4. If the water in the bowl remains clear there are no

The Glory of the Sunrise

In the Catechism of one of the great World Communions there is an opening question: "What is the chief end of man?" The answer: "To glorify God and to enjoy Him forever."

This simple question is what the Christian life is all about; this too, is what Easter is all about —the Glory of that Easter Sunrise in our world.

St. Paul, in his time, didn't waste words when describing the conduct of early church members, "Whatever you do, do all to the glory God." Including not just the priests and church officials, but everyone, and he is speaking to us today—the ordinary workers, these are the hands God needs, doing good quality, everyday work, this is what glorifies God.

In the Bread and the Wine we share with Him at the altar, we know His Presence intimately but what happens when we leave the altar, go out the church door? Is He left behind or do we take Him with us into our homes, offices, classrooms, farms? It is much more than what we do in church. Remember that Jesus uses the humblest of illustrations, the balking of bread, sowing of seeds, farmers toiling on the land; doing work with diligence; no work too trivial in His sight.

"In this I am glorified," He said, "not by offensive showiness". (Remember His rebuke to the hypocrites praying on the street corner?)

However in all our lives come those heart-wrenching times that seem the end of everything we hold dear. The Cross, of course, is the supreme example. On that fateful Friday when Love was crucified, the disciples mourned the loss of all their hopes—it was the end.

Minds boggled with the horror of it all, couldn't or wouldn't believe the women, "He is risen, He is risen— it's not the end?"

Eyes were blinded to the Glory of the Sunrise of Easter Morning.

History unfolded, proving the Cross was not the end but the beginning—the beginning of the greatest movement that has ever shaken the world— Christianity. And who were the movers in the traumatic beginning years of this tremendous movement?—those same disciples who in believing, moved from the "wrong" to the "right" side of Easter; from doom and hopelessness to promise and power and hope for the world.

Centuries later we claim to be an 'Easter people" but are we? Have we moved to the right side of Easter? Does the world see us as people with hope and courage and faith?

"He is risen, Christ is Lord, I believe!"—then show the 'I believe' in the way we live our lives. It all hinges on what we do with Easter, on being on the right side of Easter—living in the glory of Easter's Sunrise.

A blessed and happy Easter Sunrise to each of you!



Overall Brost said, "There were lots of laughs at Music Festival, the adjudicators were awesome, every competitor was smiling, and the volunteers were fantastic! The Saskatchewan Music Festival Association will be holding forty seven district music festivals throughout the province from March to May.
