And in our personal worlds, always his healing, comforting Presence; always the powerful power of pray-



I hope 2019 holds lots of time for fun, friends, food and family. I would just like to update all with a brief summary of the events at the Fire Department in 2018. Last year we were at the hall 56 different times between meeting nights and call outs. We had over 30 calls to emergency events that would be split fairly evenly between fires, MVAs and false alarms. This is slightly above our average for the last 15 years. Stephen, Elliott and I had the honor of attending the funeral of Darrel Morrison. He was the volunteer fire fighter from the Rosetown fire department who was killed while on scene at a traffic accident in heavy fog. The feeling of honor and pride when marching with over 300 hundred other first responders is something I will not soon forget. Feeling the support and unity of the entire EMS community made an incredible impression on me and I'm sure the others there as well. It was where we had to be that day. 2018 also saw the arrival of the new fire truck in October. This was the reward of 10 years of saving and 4 years of designing and planning. The hall was full of smiling firefighters, fire board members and counselors that day!!!! On Nov. 24th, with the help of Sask Energy, we hosted 15 other Fire Departments for a day of training. It was a very informative day and a great chance to meet and talk to other departments. Everyone was then invited to our hall for a quick tour and more time for networking. Five of our members have just completed their professional fire fighter training. We are awaiting their certificates in the mail. There will be more news on these fine gentlemen in a future letter.
